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Background

This paper, focusing on the Korean speaking community of the Ryde Local Government (LGA) area, has been developed in line with the City of Ryde's commitment to ensuring that policies and programs reflect community expectations and respond to community need. It provides a brief demographic description, results of the Korean Community Survey and includes a number of recommendations.

The project has been managed by the City of Ryde Community Harmony Reference Group. It commenced in August with an approach by Chinese Australian Services Society (CASS) who provide settlement services to the Chinese speaking community in Ryde LGA. CASS was looking to partner with the City of Ryde in doing a Chinese Survey to identify issues of concern for the Chinese speaking community in Ryde. This was done and a paper on Ryde's Chinese speaking community has been developed. It was considered to be a good opportunity to survey our Korean speaking community at the same time. The papers have been developed with the advice and direction from the Community Harmony Reference Group.

The City of Ryde sought advice from the Centre for Research on Social Inclusion at Macquarie University and was linked in with Mr Jeremy Koo, a Masters student of the university. Mr Koo worked with the City of Ryde to provide the data analysis for the survey and assisted in producing this paper.

Consultation Process

The community survey (see Attachment A) was translated into Korean and asked questions on:

- Ryde – The things people like about living in Ryde and what they would like to change or improve
- English proficiency
- Social issues of concern
- Settlement issues
- Utilisation of media for communication
- Safety
- Transport methods
- Volunteering
- Discrimination
- Social group involvement
- Utilisation of Korean community services
- Specific questions on Eastwood

The survey's were distributed with the assistance of volunteers from the Sydney Korean Women's Welfare Centre Coordinator - Ms Agnes Shim, Australian Korean Welfare Association – Mr Segun Song, Christian Community Aid Service – Ms Young Byun, Eastwood Local Area Command Police Station – Ms Angela Chang, Ryde Family Support Service – Kyeong Kim and Mr Jeremy Koo. The following outlines the distribution process:

- Face to face interviews took place at the Korean festival using the Interactive Van to engage involvement
- Surveys were distributed through 50 Korean businesses in Eastwood on both the east and west side of the railway line
- Adult Migrant English Classes
- An existing Korean playgroup
- Two Korean women's groups
- Two Korean churches agreed to be involved

In total 177 completed surveys were received. Of these 151 were from the Ryde LGA and 26 from outside the Ryde LGA.

The results of the survey provide a brief picture of the needs and aspirations of our Korean community. This is by no means a complete consultation process but has enabled some insight into community issues, established new links within the Korean community and methods of engagement for the future. The final recommendations in this paper outline some options for building on this information to further explore the issues raised.

The information gathered enhances consultations done with the general community. It reinforces the City of Ryde's commitment to the Social Justice Principle of Participation that encourages active citizenship as the essential ingredient in decision-making that ensures policies and programs reflect community expectations and contribute to community well-being.

Korean Community Profile

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) provides us with demographic information through the Census. This profile comes from ABS Census 2006. Additional information comes from the Department of Immigration and Multicultural Affairs (DIMA) Settlement Database - August 2006.

It is important to note when looking at ABS Census data that it includes a range of people with varying visa status including those of citizens, permanent residents and temporary visa holders. This has implications for service access issues and must be taken into consideration when viewing this data.

- In 2006 there were some 2498 people living in the Ryde LGA who were born in Korea (2.6% of the total population)
- The population of those born in Korea increased by 23% (472) from 2001 to 2006
- In 2006 there were some 2879 people living in Ryde who spoke Korean at home (3% of the total population)

The following tables provide information from the Australian Bureau of Statistics 2006 Census of Population and Housing on number of people living in Ryde who were born in Korea and information on the numbers of people living in Ryde who speak Korean at home by age groups.

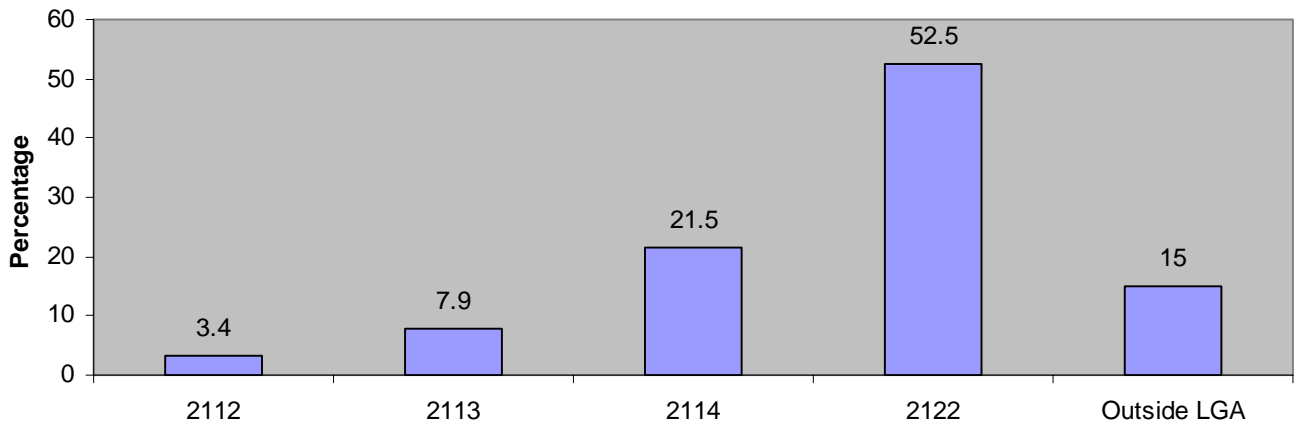

Survey findings

Where do our respondents live?

We asked people the postcode of where they lived. The majority lived in Eastwood which is reflective of where the surveys were targeted.



The postcodes relate to the following suburbs:

2112 Ryde

2113 Maquarie Park, Marsfield and North Ryde

2114 Denistone, Denistone West, Denistone East, Meadowbank, Melrose Park and West Ryde

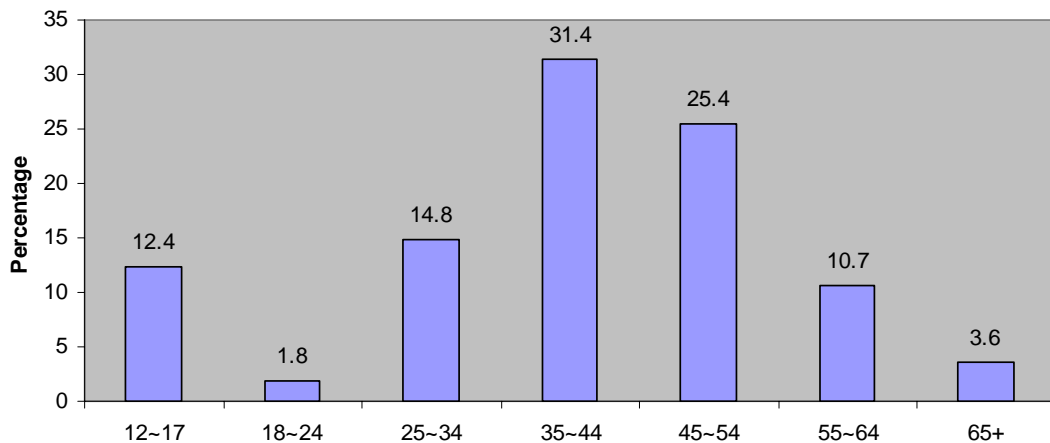
2122 Eastwood

The 26 surveys from outside of the Ryde LGA came from many different suburbs of Sydney. These included Baulkham Hills, Beecroft, Carlingford, Campsie, Dundas, Epping, Ermington, Lidcombe, Milperra, North Strathfield, Rhodes, Rydalmere and West Pennant Hills.

Who responded?

- Of the 151 respondents 71.9% were female and 28.1% male.
- The majority (98.9%) of respondents were born in Korea with 1.1% born in Australia.
- The majority of respondents, 95.5%, spoke Korean at home with 2.3% speaking English.

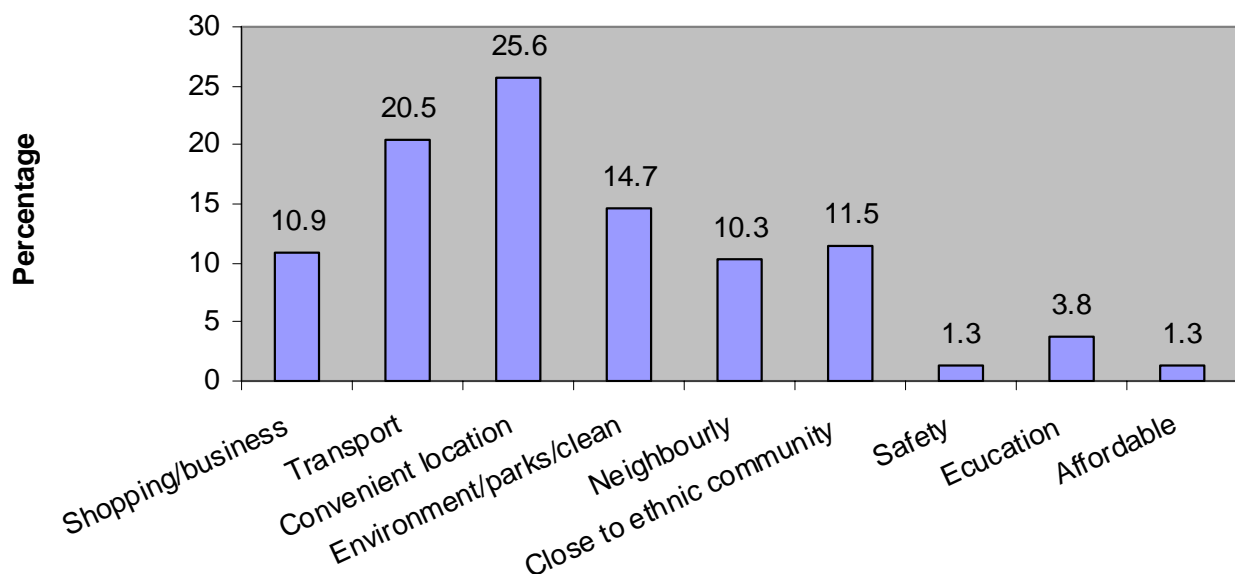
Age groups of respondents



Ryde – The things people like about living in Ryde and what they would like to change or improve

The most common responses from our Korean speaking community were that convenient location, transport and the environment (parks/clean) were things people liked about living in Ryde. Results also included shopping and neighbourliness. This was very similar to the results of the City Vision consultation in 2002 where the general community described what they liked best about Ryde as “...its central location along with good shopping, parks, foreshores and public transport”. Respondents also nominated living close to people from their own cultural background as being good about living in Ryde.

What would you like to change or improve in the Ryde LGA?

The survey respondents would like to see changes and/or improvements for the Ryde LGA in:

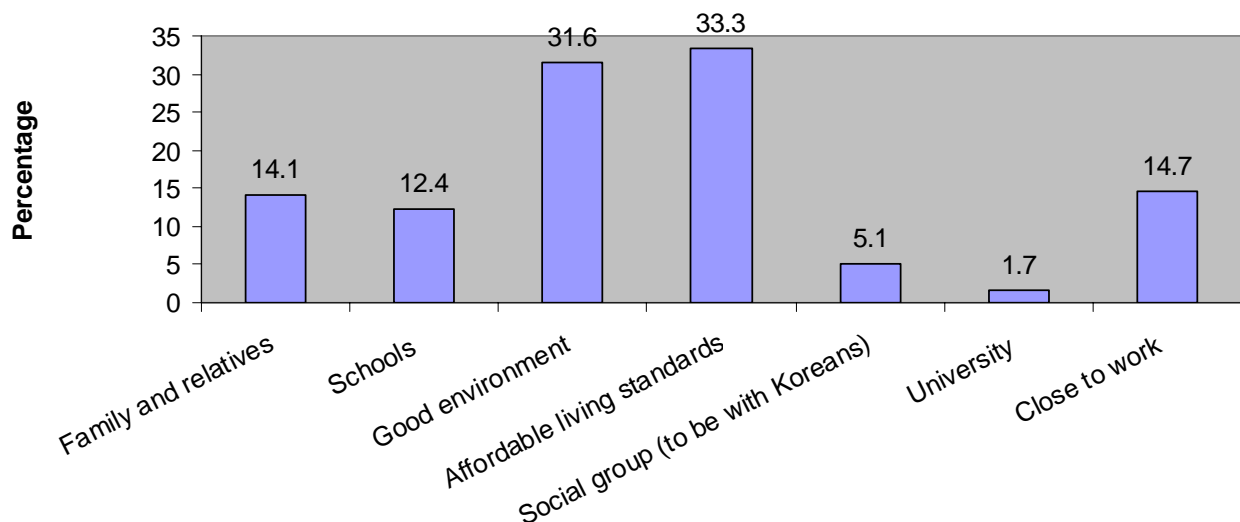
- Parking 37.5%
- More social groups – increased community services 23.9%
- Safety/police/lighting 17%
- Public Transport 15.9%

Other responses included: business, environment – parks/cleanliness, respect people/racism, road maintenance, more library books and more apartments.

The results differ in some respects from those of the City Vision 2002 survey where the general community wanted “...improved roads, traffic and public transport, green areas and parks, less high density housing and better shopping”.

Respondents were allowed to choose more than one response in indicating the reasons they chose to live in the Ryde LGA.

Residency

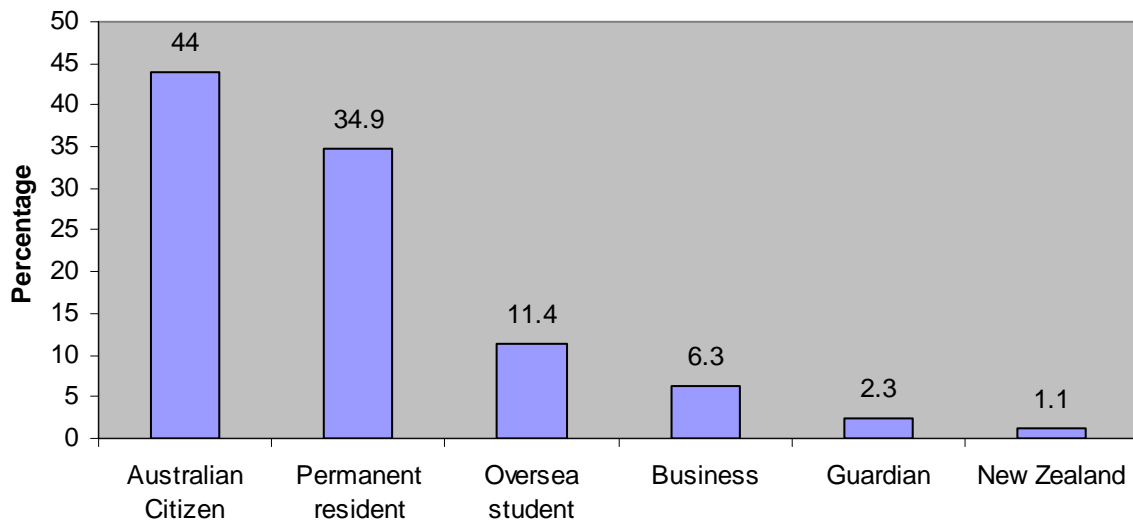
The answers to questions on residency help us in planning services. There are many organisations whose funding restricts them to only provide service for people who have lived in Australia less than five years and who are permanent residents.

Of the 151 respondents the years lived in the Ryde LGA and Australia were:

The results in relation to length of residency in Ryde give us an indication of secondary migration for the respondents from our Korean speaking community with the majority of those surveyed living in Ryde for less than 5 years but the majority of those surveyed living in Australia for more than 10 years.

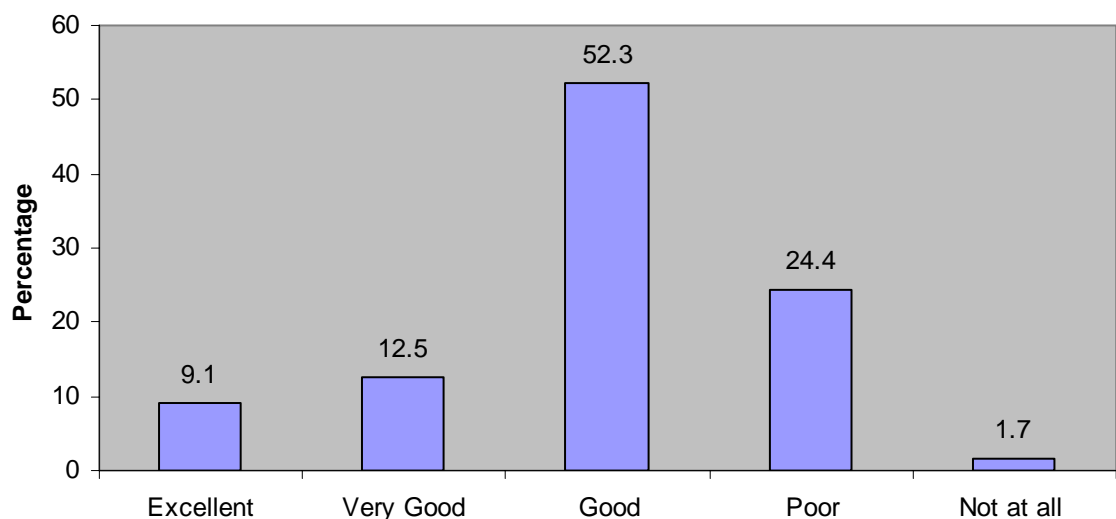
What is your residency status?

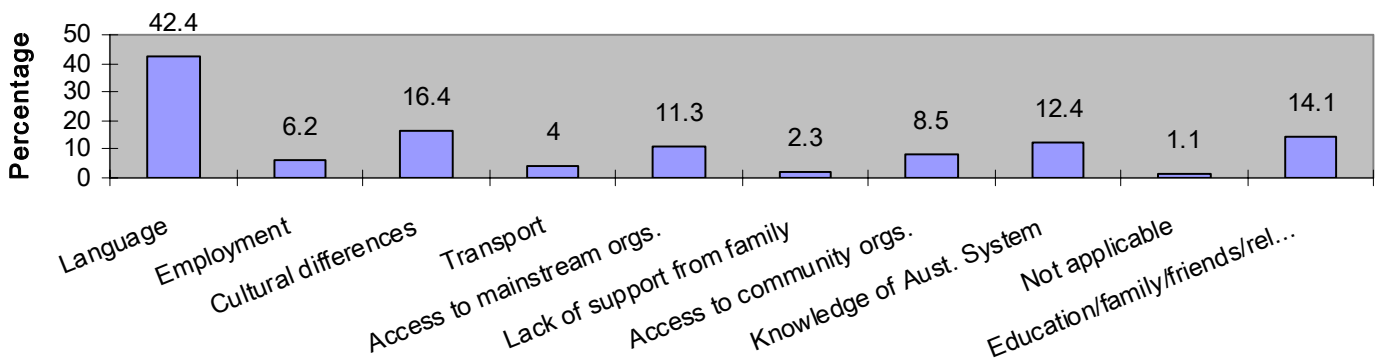
Settlement

While some migrants who arrive in Ryde appear to need minimal assistance with settling, there are many newly-arrived migrants for whom the issues identified below are relevant. To provide accessible and equitable services we need to be mindful of these issues. When asked: "*When you first arrived in Australia, what were/are the greatest difficulties you faced?*", the following issues were identified (more than one choice was allowed)

The survey asked respondents what barriers they faced in overcoming issues of settlement. The answers received confirm that language is the most significant issue and barrier for our Korean speaking community.

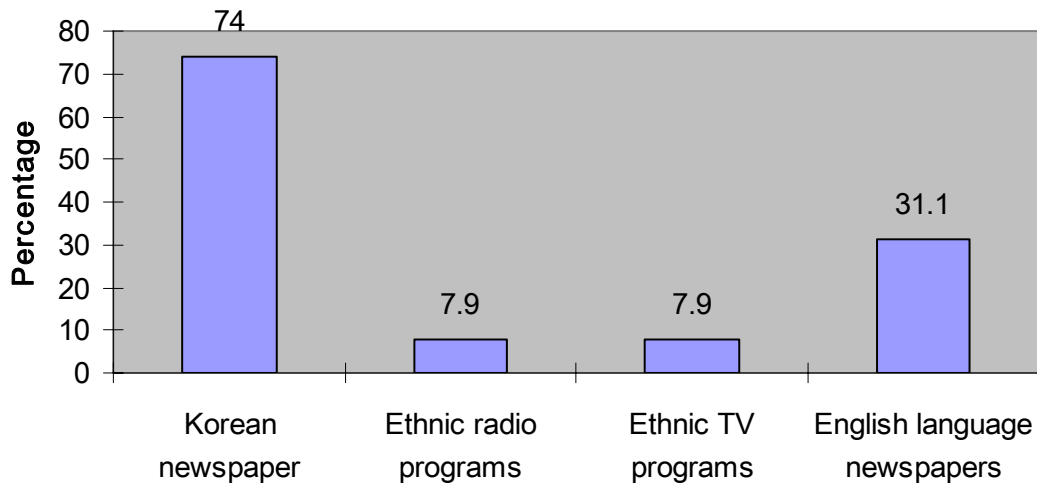
What has been a barrier to overcoming the issues you faced?

The responses to this question help as a guide in how we might make contact with our Korean speaking community when promoting or providing information on our services.

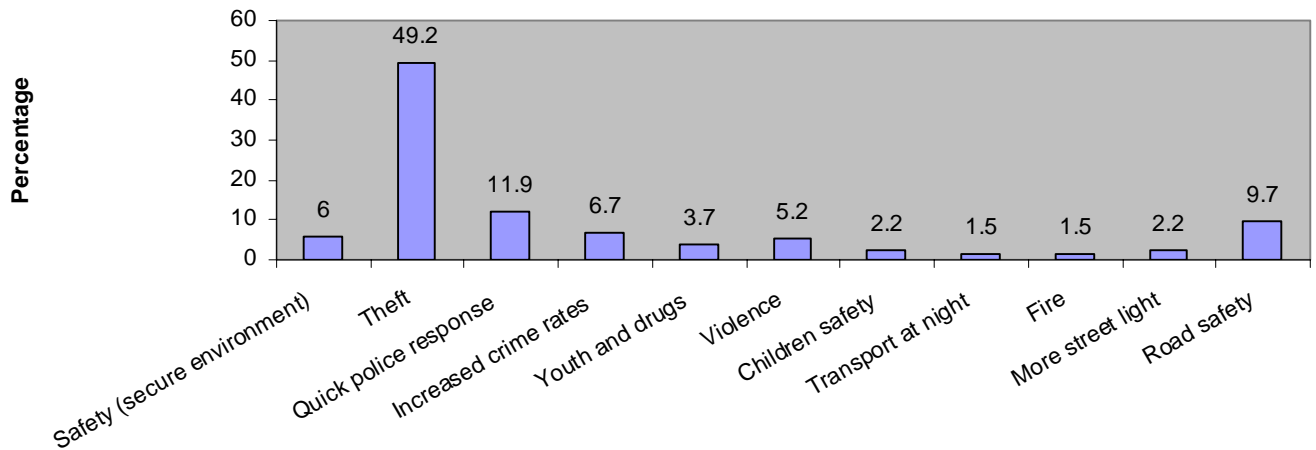
How do you get to know about events and services in Ryde and Sydney?



Safety

When asked about how safe they felt living in the Ryde LGA, the majority of respondents, 45.9%, were unsure about feeling safe or unsafe. The main safety concerns were theft and the environment (how safe a place looks).

What are your main safety concerns?

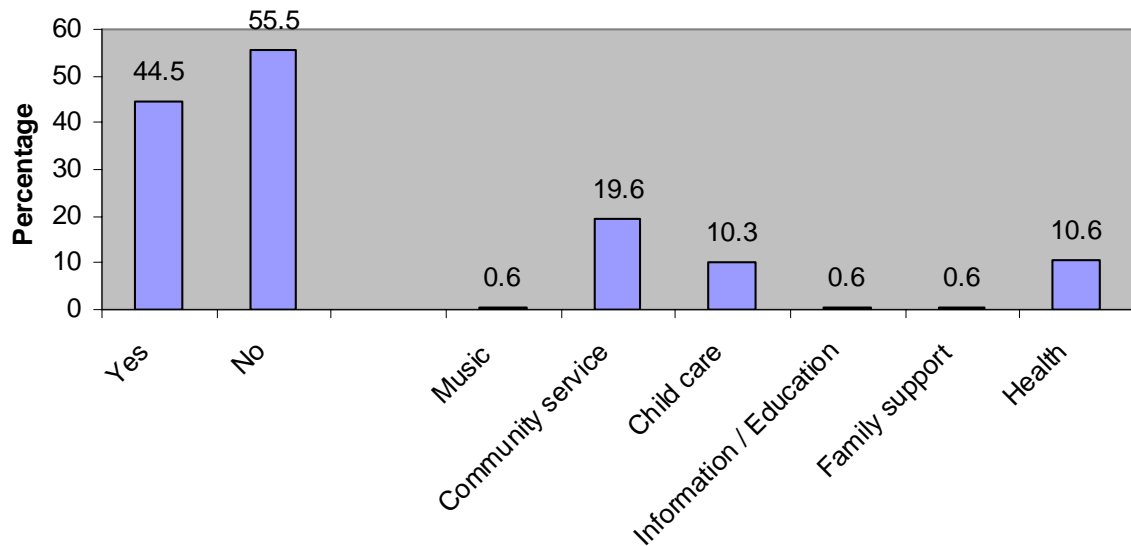


Transport

When asked: "What transport do you use in the Ryde area?" Most respondents used a car (68.9%). Of those who used public transport 44.6% used Trains and 23.7% used Buses. Only 9.6% walked as an option. (More than one choice was allowed)

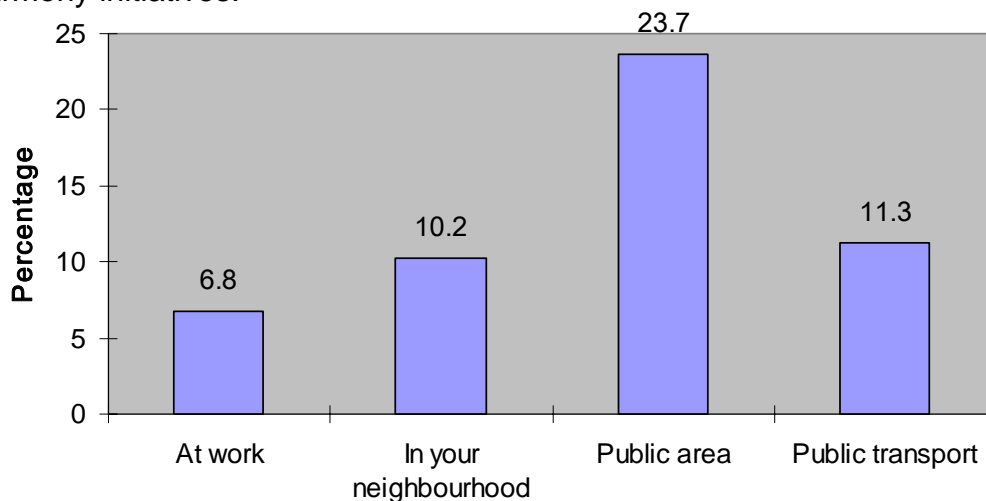
Volunteering

Discrimination

The information provided below on where people have been discriminated against helps us make decisions about where we can target community harmony initiatives.



Social group involvement

Only 21.9% of respondents said they were a regular attendee at a group. Of these most attended a church (52.1%) with the rest attending private, musical, sports club, veteran or community meetings.

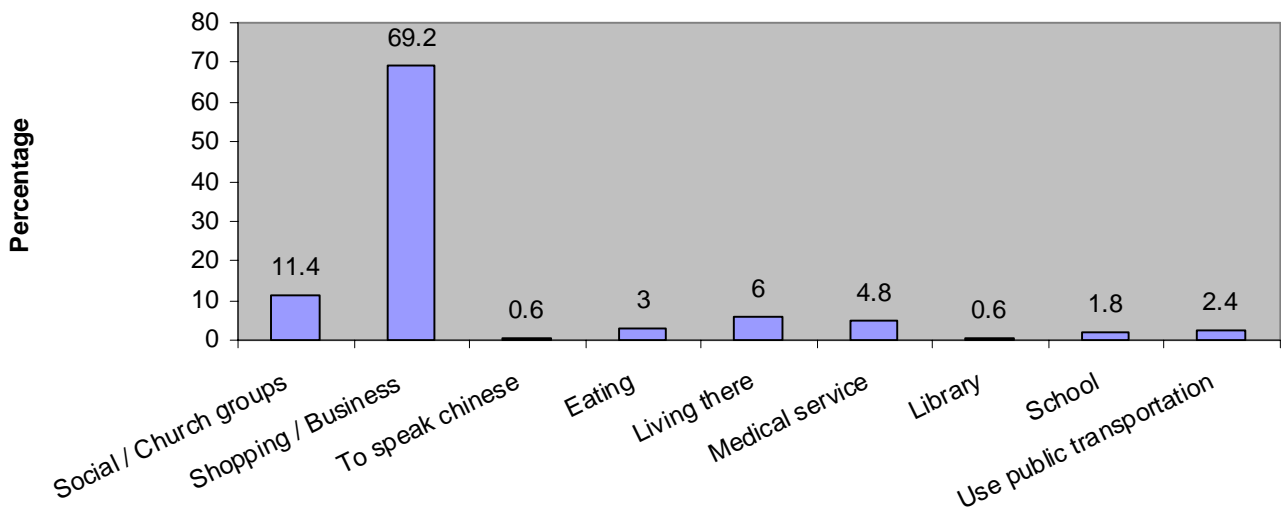
Often social groups or clubs are the main way that the City Of Ryde and other organisations has links with our Korean speaking community. This information highlights the challenges of making contacts or providing information and the need to diversify the way we do this.

There was 71.6% of respondents who were interested in joining a group (44.1% activity/interest group, 23.2% women’s group, 1.1 Senior Group and 3.2% other groups).

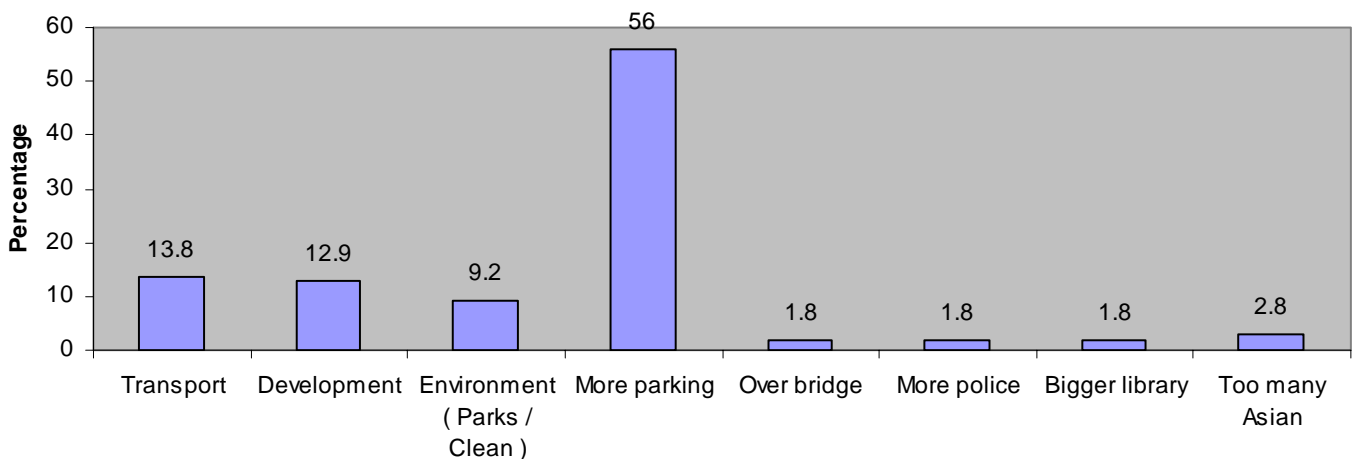
Eastwood

Recommendation

English language proficiency

Promotion and development of community English classes taught by qualified English teachers for migrants who have completed their free 510 hours English course and wish to further their learning of English.

To develop strategies on English language classes with key partners including Macquarie Community College, Adult Migrant English Program, TAFE and CASS.

Library services

To continue to explore options for resourcing to increase the collection of Korean books and magazines.

Social group involvement

To explore options with key Korean organisations to provide support Korean speaking social groups.

Volunteering

To provide an annual Korean-speaking volunteer training course in partnership with SKWWC and AKWA. Additional benefits will be the introduction of services provided by the City of Ryde and community organisations in order to encourage community participation through volunteering with them. It is believed that successful volunteering will lead to employment opportunities as well as breaking down of language barrier.

Utilisation of services

Encourage services to increase promotion through translated flyers, posters and Korean media particularly in relation to settlement and aged care.

Safety

To develop community strategies which promote Ryde as a safe community and respond to safety issues identified within the community.
