



About Kids Teaching Kids

Kids Teaching Kids is a school-based education model that inspires young people to learn and care for their local environment.

Kids Teaching Kids uses local environmental issues as a theme for learning. The Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model uses 'peer teaching and learning' pedagogy – where the traditional roles of teacher and student change. The teachers become the facilitators and the students are empowered to take responsibility for their own learning.

Through the education techniques offered in the Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model, students learn with their head, heart and hand. In other words, students are encouraged into thinking, feeling and developing practical ways to respond to the challenges facing our environment.

The Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model is free and is most suited to students from Kinder to year 11. Kids Teaching Kids is open to all government, independent and private schools. It is consistent with the state and national curriculum guidelines.

Kids Teaching Kids **Learning Model**

The Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model is unique. It is inspired by the Learning Pyramid^{©*} that shows students might only retain 5% of knowledge through lecture and other traditional learning styles. In contrast, students retain up to 90% through teaching others.

At the heart of the Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model is a belief that peer education is one of the most effective ways to encourage students to take responsibility for their learning and actions.

When peer education is applied to environmental issues, it can bring about great results for the sustainability of local communities all over Australia.

For over a decade, the Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model has been recognised by leading Australian education and environmental organisations for its ability to work across different year levels in upper primary and secondary schools nationally.

The Learning Pyramid



How it works

The Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model connects students with a local environmental issue and offers them the skills to develop their learning into a workshop, which can inspire local environmental action.


Rather than mandate a step-by-step process, the Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model provides a framework that can be adapted to suit teachers and students.

- Students are encouraged to choose an environmental issue most relevant to their community and take greater responsibility for their learning.
- Teachers are supported to act as facilitators through phone and online support from the Kids Teaching Kids Education and Events Team.

 Schools are introduced to an external mentor with subject matter expertise on environmental issues to support the students and teachers through their learning.

The Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model has been delivered to more than 110,000 participants around Australia. Part of this success comes from its flexible design and the ongoing support offered from the Kids Teaching Kids Education and Events Team.

A step by step guide

The Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model is easy to follow and there is support from the Education and Events team at every step along the way.

Getting started

- Schools are invited to register and take part in the Kids Teaching Kids Program
- Registered schools receive the Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model educational materials

Making it happen

The Kids Teaching Kids Education and Events Team assists each registered school and offers:

- Support for students to identify local environmental issues
- Guidance for teachers to act as facilitators
- Support finding an external mentor with subject matter expertise to bring real world thinking and stimulus to enhance the students learning
- Where possible an Education Officer will visit registered schools to assist students with workshop presentation development

The learning outcome

Students present their learning through a dedicated workshop presentation

The Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model was created from a belief that our education system has an important role to play in building resilient, confident and creative students. The Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model was designed according to the extensive research into the attributes of the Resilient Child literature including:

Social competence

 pro-social behaviours such as responsiveness, empathy, caring, communication skills, a sense of humour

• Problem solving skills

- abstract and reflective thinking, flexibility

Autonomy

 an internal locus of control, a strong sense of independence, power, self esteem, self discipline and control

· A sense of purpose and future

 healthy expectancies, goal direction, orientation to the future, motivation to achieve, persistence, belief in a bright and compelling future

The Kids Teaching Kids Program has demonstrated that developing social resilience in our children empowers them to take ownership over their patch of land, to feel a sense of connection with their natural environment, and to take care of it.

The Kids Teaching Kids Learning Model reflects the education standards set by each state and territory, as well as the National Curriculum which now places a greater emphasis on students learning how to be good citizens, how to relate to one another and how this can be taught in an authentic context.

The Learning Model fosters a deep understanding of local community issues and it offers students the opportunity to develop a wide range of life long learning skills including:

- Research
- Teamwork
- External mentoring
- · Community engagement
