	The Committee asked that a width of 1.8m be considered. This width benefits users with prams, mobility scooters etc. This is the minimum width considered suitable by the committee. Response from Project Manager is that the width would impede the Sydney Blue Gum High Forest and as such is not warranted. Project Manager outlined that the bridge width would be 1.2m wide between handrails.
