4. Presentation by Waste Coordinator - Denise Torres

Denise presented on activities carried out by Council's Waste Team, especially in regard to recycling.

The team is responsible for domestic and commercial waste, investigating illegal dumping, management of hazardous and contaminated waste.

The group focusses on behavioural change education and works within community, local schools and other councils.

Some of the major tasks of the group involve managing dumping in the Macquarie Park area, conducting events at Habitat, very successful Waste to Art program, composting and waste tours.

It was noted that the dumping of food is a major issue with food accounting for 42% of household rubbish.

Services offered by Council include:

- Support for Clean Up Australia
- Household chemical clean-ups
- Chipping and mulching service
- Medical waste service
- Tv and computer collections
- Worm farms
- 2nd hand Saturday
- Providing 5 household clean-ups per year
- Assisting with easy care gardening
- Coordinating clothing bins and recycling stations at Council

A system is currently being trialled in local libraries and shopping centres to recycle items such as batteries and globes.

Major issues for waste are:

- Increasing population
- Increase in disposal costs
- Toxicity of much of the waste created
- Illegal dumping

Contact to be made with Michael Mobbs regarding ways to reduce food waste

An invitation is to be extended for a staff member from waste to address the committee again in twelve months to update the group on any new initiatives.

Macquarie University Sustainability Group

The above group has won an award for its use of tap water. It has been involved in a nationwide campaign run by Sydney Water called TAP.

It has also created a water bottle made of sugar cane and has installed two new drinking tap stations at the uni.
