Declarations of Interest

There were no conflicts of interest declared from Committee members.

Mr Edwards confirmed that the following applications have been received for funding:-

30 Miriam Road, Denistone

- Works involve repairs to slate roof tiles and painting exterior sections of upper dormers on both sides.
- Council previously awarded \$5,000 in August 2015 for repairs to the roof, including repairs to slate tiles, repointing and repairs / repainting of timber joinery.
- Not recommended for additional funding as the works have previously been funded.

Committee agreed with recommendation for no additional funding.

Noted.

10 Cambridge Street, Gladesville

- Works involve repairs to timber joinery including dormer windows, window architraves. Extensive repairs to external weatherboards and verandah flooring and posts, repainting of exterior.
- The owners have been in extensive communications with Mr Edwards and have spent over \$13,000 undertaking works in last six months.
- The works result in a very high positive outcome and directly enhance the significance of the heritage item.
- Scoring of 53/55 (96%) on the assessment matrix.
- Application seeking \$5,000.
- Recommendation that the application be supported and \$5,000 be awarded.

Committee agreed with recommendation for payment of \$5,000.

75 Forsyth Street, West Ryde

- Works involve re-tuckpointing to the front façade of the dwelling house.
- Retains original tuckpointing in sound condition and repair.
- Dwelling forms part of the group of heritage listed dwellings in Forsyth Street.
- The works result in a very high positive outcome and directly enhance the significance of the heritage item.
- Scoring of 57/60 (95%) on the assessment matrix.
- Application seeking \$4,550.
- Recommendation that the application be supported and \$3,000 be awarded.

Committee agreed with recommendation for payment of \$3,000.

Mr Govender to investigate if balance of funding in the amount of \$1,080 can be given this financial year and the remaining balance of \$1,920 next financial year or if the owners need to wait until next financial year (July 2019) to receive the full amount of \$3,000.

Details Action

512 Victoria Road, Ryde

- This application involves repairs to timber joinery on the front elevation of the building known as 'Squireville'.
- Committee noted deferral of application.

- The works appear to involve repairs to non-original fabric.
- The building was also repainted, but applicant forgot to include.
- Application is being deferred, so the application can amend accordingly.

3 Tyrell Street Gladesville

- This application was considered at the February 2019 Committee meeting, however it was advised that the application was not eligible for funding as the works had not been completed.
- Application seeking funding for repainting of timber joinery.
- Heritage Advisor has spoken to applicant, however the applicant has since withdrawn the application as they did not want to do the work without certainty they would receive funding.

Committee noted that the application has been withdrawn.

7. Report from Council

2018/2019 Heritage Study update

Mr Edwards advised that since the last meeting, there has been significant advancement with regards to the Heritage Study. Mr Edwards confirmed that the consultants now have a shortlist of properties for Council to identify which ones should be pursued for further investigation and detailed assessment.

The information was noted – update to be provided at next meeting.

Mr Edwards advised that there are a number of new properties which have been identified for listing. Mr Edwards confirmed that the nominations that the Committee have been putting forward have been appreciated and that lots have been investigated and a good number have made the final cut for further investigation and there will be a good number of new listings coming out of this process.

Mr Govender advised that there is more technical work to do, prior to a Workshop being held with the Councillors. Following the workshop, a report will be presented to Council, at which point the properties will become public. Mr Govender confirmed that by the next meeting, Council staff will have a better idea of a timeline and will be able to update the Committee at its next meeting.

Interim Heritage Orders – update

68 Denistone Road

Mr Govender advised that in September 2018 Council resolved to place an Interim Heritage Order on 68 Denistone Road. Since that time Council staff have been working through a range of issues regarding that property including working with the owner to gain access to undertake inspections and making sure that no further work occurs on the property.

The information was noted.

Council staff have developed a Planning Proposal which has obtained a Gateway Determination and will be placed on public exhibition. Mr Govender advised that the Interim Heritage Order expires in September so the next step is to put the Planning Proposal out on public exhibition. Following the exhibition period, the Planning Proposal will go back to Council to get property on the list.

68-70 Chatham Road

Mr Govender confirmed that in February 2019, Council resolved to place an Interim Heritage Order on the properties at 68-70 Chatham Road and noted that from the original Council resolution the protection time for an Interim Heritage Order is six months, however once a Planning Proposal has been prepared and goes to Gateway, that increases the protection to 12 months.

The information was noted.

Mr Govender advised that the next step is to prepare a Planning Proposal which Council staff are currently in the process of doing. The owner has appealed the Interim Heritage Order on the grounds that the owner believes the property does not have any heritage significance so if the appeal is accepted then it will need to go through the Court process.

Macquarie Centre Ice Skating Rink

Mr Govender confirmed that the Ice Skating Rink has a State Interim Heritage Order placed on it, however Council will undertake its own heritage analysis to determine whether it should be a Local or State item. If investigations determined that there is potential for significance, a Planning Proposal will be presented to Council recommending that it be put on the Schedule.

Mr Edwards confirmed that the Consultant to undertake the heritage analysis work for the Ice Skating Rink was appointed today.

Consultation for Ryde Local Strategic Planning Strategy (LSPS)

Mr Govender advised the Ryde Local Strategic Planning Strategy (LSPS) is a document which needs to be developed under the provisions of Act which will support the technical documents (LEP and DCP). The LSPS document will outline how the LEP and DCP synchronise with the vision for the North District Plan, the Community Strategic Plan and other plans.

The information was noted.

The information was noted.

Mr Govender confirmed that a workshop with the Councillors regarding the draft LSPS document will be held in May 2019 and following that the draft LSPS document is required to go out on public exhibition by 1 July 2019. Public Exhibition will progress through July and August, following which the results of the exhibition will collated and processed during September and October and then reported to Council in November 2019 as the LSPS document needs to be in place by December 2019.

Upgrade of Coulter Street

Mr Edwards showed the Committee the proposed artwork for concrete paving for the upgrade of Coulter Street. The artwork has already been distributed to the Committee for comment and the feedback received to date is appreciated.

The information was noted.

Mr Edwards confirmed that Council staff will be working through the comments and will formulate a response and recommendations back to the Open Space Team. Mr Edwards is confident that some changes will be made to the artwork as a result of the Committees comments.

Mr Govender confirmed that we will need to move quickly on this as the timeframe for works to be completed is scheduled for the end of June 2019.

- Ivanhoe Estate Redevelopment Proposal (increase from 300 to 500 dwellings, impact on Sydney Turpentine and Ironbark Forest).
- Generic Plans of Management for parks and reserves rather than specific ones
- Buffalo Creek Pedestrian Bridge the society needs to know what is happening and when.
- Post-election scrapping of the Office of Environment and Heritage. The
 Department of Planning and Industry will deal now with matters pertaining to
 the State's natural and build environments.
- Field of Mars Cemetery expansion (retention fence).
- Dangerous steps at Kennedy Street.
- Middle grass project to reduce weeds and improve habitat for small birds.

The information was noted.

Field of Mars Reserve

Management

 There has been fruitful and constructive consultation with Councillors and Council Officers.

Activities

- Decrease in visitor numbers in February/March due to the hot weather and storms.
- Clean Up Australia Day was well done, clean up on an ad hoc basis is undertaken by members and friends, especially after rainstorms when much rubbish is washed into the reserve - There is a need for community education to raise awareness concerning the destination of dropped rubbish.

- The Reserve has hosted a Probus Club, William Dean Public School from just west of Quakers Hill (not a visit to the Environment Education Centre but for walks and water testing) and Ryde East Natural Environment Group (visits once or twice a month).
