| -<br>-<br>-<br>-<br>-   | This program has been running for a number of years but is being conducted in a slightly different way this year.  The aim of the fund is to encourage conservation of heritage items in CoR To coincide with the Ryde Heritage Review in 2019, Council provided a one-off injection to the fund of \$500,000, which is a significant increase in funding from \$20,000 in previous years. This means that there is substantial opportunity for a wider number of applications to be received. Grants up to \$15,000 are now available. This is up from the previous amount of up to \$5,000.  The first round of funding was open from 18th February to 7th April 2021. Eligible projects need to involve conservation works or works that contribute to the significance of a listed heritage item that is a residential property.  This year, contributory items in conservation areas are eligible for funding, as per the Council resolution of December 2019.  To be eligible, works need to be completed prior to funding being sought Works must be completed by qualified tradespeople Invoices need to accompany applications |           |
|                         | 33 applications have been received in the current period 7 are duplicates – i.e they relate to the same property 13 have been assessed as eligible for funding. Some are ineligible as works are unauthorised i.e the works have been completed without the necessary statutory approvals or exemptions, not eligible i.e weed removal/suppression or the works have not yet been completed. Approximately 140 enquiries were made regarding the scheme. A second round of funding will be announced early in 2022. This committee will be provided with advice regarding eligible funding applications only.   |           |

- Draft legislation regarding the listing for the Macquarie Ice Rink is with the Draft Parliamentary Committee.
- It is considered that the listing is imminent.
- Brush Farm Bowling Club has been closed for some time and the site vacated.
- Council has resolved that a heritage assessment be undertaken.
- A site inspection has been carried out and the draft assessment is expected to be received in the next couple of weeks.

## 6. Report from Community Representatives

#### Flora and Fauna Society - Lyn Langtry advised as follows:

- Environmental challenges and issues on a local, state and national level were addressed including Ivanhoe Estate, Meadowbank Precinct, Manor houses, natural areas, FOM draft Masterplan, Sager Place, Blenheim, Jim Walsh and Magdala Parks, powerful owls, Boronia Park, Gladesville Village, gas/coal projects, koalas, feral horses, the nuclear industry, Crown lands, climate control and Warragamba Dam.
- Seven editions of Wallumetta were published.

#### Other reports covered the following matters:

- FOM foxes continue to be eradicated, there are fewer dogs and bikes but there has been an increase in the cat population; COVID-19 saw a tripling of visitors and now it is double the number of two years ago; younger family groups are coming through; activities included bird walks and Clean Up Australia
- FOM Consultative Committee (with RCC) considered dogs, Bushcare, bushfires, weed management and six bush regeneration sites
- Parramatta River Catchment Committee aim for swimming by 2025 and monitoring of construction activity controls

## Linda Evans

- A new arts precinct has opened at Macquarie University and is spectacular.
- The Australian History Museum and Ancient History Museum at the Uni have been combined and the restored museum is now open to the public.
- It was suggested that perhaps a future meeting of this committee could be held at the Museum.
- Linda and Kim Phillips have discussed internships for students of history at the Uni to work with the Ryde District Historical Society.
- Student numbers in Linda's course have increased from 7 to 87.
- A number of students are currently working as interns with the Historical Society.

## Peter Mitchell

- There are no updates from the Bennelong Committee.
- The Halvorsen site at Putney has been approved with public access through the site and Aboriginal interpretation works required.
- If archaeological items are found on site, work will need to cease
- Council's Heritage Advisor advised the committee that the approval granted by the Land and Environment Court is a concept approval only – not the final approval, and a future DA will be required that fits within the parameters of the concept approval.

## Kim Phillips

- The Historical Society was not permitted to use Willandra whilst the roof was being redone.
- This and COVID meant the Society was quiet for most of 2020.

A future meeting of this committee to be held at the University is possible.
