1. Welcome, Attendance and Apologies  Cir Purcell welcomed all present to the meeting and acknowledged the traditional owners of the land.  The attendance and apologies were recorded as above.  Tim Hunt of Novartis welcomed all present also.	Noted.	
Confirmation of Minutes of the previous meeting and matters arising  The minutes from the meeting of 8 May were confirmed.	The minutes were confirmed.	
3. Macquarie Park Marketing Plan – Lee Valentine and Doug Clark from Hoyne  John Brown introduced consultants Hoyne. Hoyne has been chosen to work with Council to develop the Macquarie Park Marketing Plan.  Hoyne has offices in Sydney, Melbourne and Brisbane and specialises in place and property and has undertaken work for a number of Councils including Parramatta, Penrith and Lake Macquarie.  Hoyne has been working with various local stakeholders and to date has the following observations:  - The economic profile prepared for Macquarie Park is excellent.  - The area has great opportunities.  - Need to attract more businesses and start-ups - to achieve this, need to offer what businesses want.  - Mac Park is a talent pipeline - there are a lot of talented people in the catchment area.  - It is a proven business location with some big players.  - Public transport is good and getting better.  - Better pedestrian access is needed and there are things to do; the area is on its way.  - Mac Park has the advantage of already being established with growing collaboration.  - Technology will mean big changes in the future and Mac Park has partnerships and testing facilities all available in the area.  - Mac Park is a premier business location for Sydney and is suitable for technology ecosystem, use and growth.  - Individual stories should be used to create an interest in the area, especially when targeting overseas markets.  - The upcoming metro will be a big positive.  - Businesses which are active on social media are encouraged to talk up Mac Park.  - There are lots of opportunities in big publications with wide circulation.  - The next steps are to obtain more marketing content from the businesses operating in Mac Park.  - An employee benchmark will be undertaken.  - Will talk soon to landowners and learn their plans.  - Start to talk up "hub" contacts.  - Will speak with the Dept of Planning, Connect and other players in the area. Marg Prendergast from Transport for NSW provided an update on the Macquarie Park Transport Access Plan.		
<ul> <li>Key information included: <ul> <li>Less than two months to closure of rail line (30 Sept 2018);</li> <li>Lots of roadworks being undertaken;</li> <li>There will be additional shoulder peak bus services which will be a permanent addition;</li> <li>Just over 20,000 people use the three stations in the Macquarie Park precinct;</li> <li>The provision of buses, drivers and signage are all on track and the awareness campaign will commence on 2 September.</li> <li>Tow away zones will operate and traffic signal phasing is under review;</li> <li>A construction forum for builders in Mac Park will be held. Numerous information sessions have also been held with local businesses etc.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	The information provided was noted.	
4. Connect Macquarie Park + North Ryde update		
<ul> <li>Zara Whitwell advised that she has resigned from Connect to take up the role of Executive Director at Venture Café.</li> <li>Zara noted that the business community now contribute a greater proportion of the funds (compared to State and Local Govt Contributions); membership continues to grow.</li> <li>Since 2013, a reduction of 20% in the number of "drive alone" trips by Connect members has been achieved.</li> <li>CoHop2 will launch this month.</li> <li>Zara thanked all present and all those involved with Connect for their support during her time with the group.</li> <li>John Brown (on behalf of Council) publically thanked and acknowledged Zara's achievements at Connect.</li> </ul>	The information was noted.	
5. Case Study – how Novartis is responding to the train closure		
- Tim Hunt provided a case study on how Novartis has prepared for the rail shutdown.		
<ul> <li>He advised that a formal project team was established to not only investigate how the shutdown would be handled, but what will happen when the works are completed.</li> <li>Sixty ideas were generated from staff and provided to the team.</li> <li>The final decision was to adopt flexible working hours which will allow staff to work late or early. Staff and management are working</li> </ul>	The information was noted.	
collaboratively to deliver a good outcome for workers and the business.  - Managers are proactively approaching staff to encourage flexibility.  - Keoride, carpooling and other travel arrangements are also being encouraged.		



-	There has been a consistent stream of information to support staff. Mr Hunt encouraged Local and State Government to work together to expand the walking tracks through the National Park. Tim believes there is a great opportunity to create walking/bike paths from Pennant Hill to the city through Macquarie Park.
