the meeting.  CIr Perram advised that this would be the final meeting of the Forum prior to the local government election to be held on 9 <sup>th</sup> September 2017.	Noted	
He advised that at the time of the election, all Advisory Committees are dissolved.		
Confirmation of Minutes		
The Committee confirmed the Minutes of the Meeting of 4 <sup>th</sup> May 2017.	The minutes of 4 <sup>th</sup> May 2017 were endorsed.	
2. Macquarie Park Public Art and Spaces Plan		
David Cianci from Artscape addressed the Committee.	The advice provided was noted.	
Currently, development proposals over 10,000m <sup>2</sup> are required to provide some form of public art. Many developers are seeking guidance from Council as to what is expected. As a result, a public art plan for the Macquarie Park corridor over the next 10 – 20 years is being developed which provides themes and principles to guide public art for Developers and Council.	Further details will be made available as the Plan progresses.	
Three main areas are being studied: - Macquarie University Station Precinct - Commercial Core - North Ryde Station Precinct The "tagline" of the project is "an endless pursuit of the better".		
It is noted that Lachlan's Line is outside the study area.		
The vision is for Macquarie Park is to become a destination for public art – themes include:  - Experimentation - Risk taking - Collaboration - Provision of a legacy - Testing of boundaries - New concepts such as data art		
It was noted that art displays should not be static; ever changing as people move in.		
Specific principles have been developed to create a destination and to inspire people who visit the precinct and to guide the delivery of Public art in the precinct.		
It was noted that Shrimptons Creek is considered a place of respite; this should be reflected in the art installations offered.		
Elouera Reserve could be revitalised as a space for children and adults to enjoy.		
Cottonwood Reserve is currently underutilised –bespoke exercise equipment could be installed with an 'artistic element'.		
The Plan being prepared will also provide advice on how to engage		



public artists and steps in the EOI process.		
An integrated approach between developers, Council, parks staff is the goal.

	noetze from Transport for NSW provided an update on the trie Park Transport Access Plan.	The information provided	
Key info	ormation included:	was noted.	
•	Bus priority works and the Epping Road upgrade near the stations will commence soon.		
•	Transport NSW is working with Planning NSW and other groups to improve transport over the next 5 years whilst works are underway.		
•	120 extra bus services will be added during the rail shutdown.		
•	The Gordon to Macquarie Park route will not proceed however direct buses from Epping Station to Macquarie University will be timetabled.		
•	The need to have motorists use public transport was reiterated.		
•	Stage 1 will create bus priority and bus jump lanes at the intersection of Herring and Epping Road. Bus priority works will also take place at the intersection of Lane Cove and Epping Roads.		
•	The work to improve signalisation and road widening at Ivanhoe Place cannot proceed in Stage 1 due to the location of utilities.		
•	Stage 2 will see a dedicated bus lane in Waterloo Road.		
•	Interim shuttle services will take place during the rail shutdown but no confirmation of this starting prior to the shutdown.		
•	There will be more trains on the northern line during 2017 and 2018.		
4. Mac	quarie Park Strategic Review Update		
•	Malcolm McDonald from Department of Planning and Environment advised that the Macquarie Park Strategic Investigation is ongoing, with an urban design study to commence shortly.		
•	The traffic modelling included in the Investigation is being used to understand the growth occurring in the Macquarie Park area.		
•	The Plan indicated that the network is at near capacity.		
•	75% of users drive to Macquarie Park.		
•	The constraints and opportunities of the Park are also being investigated and will be reported on.		
•	The Investigation will ensure the importance of Macquarie Park is realised.		
•	It was agreed that it is important not to undermine the employment potential of the precinct. The Department is considering a range of land use scenarios to support a vibrant, successful precinct.		



•	Work is also being undertaken regarding the provision of both primary and high schools in the area.		
•	Efforts are being made to identify open space sites and school sites including for vertical schools.		
•	There are on-going discussions regarding whether Macquarie Park should be a stand-alone employment zone or if it should be a mixed use site with residential areas.

•	The short term parking trial in Giffnock Ave (40 spaces converted to 2 hours parking) has received positive support to date. A report to Council is planned later this year.	The information was noted.	John Brown
•	The all-day parking fee has been removed with parking charged at \$3 p/hr (which is the current fee).		
•	This rate is less than that charged by Parramatta and North Sydney Councils.		
•	Additional funds raised from increases to parking fees will be used to support transport initiatives.		
•	The upgrade along Byfield Ave is complete.		
•	The Macquarie Park Public Art and Spaces Plan is being funded by the Levy.		
•	The Shrimptons Creek and Elouera Reserve projects are underway and will include public WiFi, public art and smart technologies.		
7. Con	nect Macquarie Park + North Ryde Update		
The rep	ort was provided by Zara Whitwell of Connect.		
The upo	date highlighted:		
•	Seven new members have been signed to Connect during the past twelve months.	The information was noted.	
•	46% of employees in the Macquarie Park Precinct are members of Connect.		
•	45% of members drive alone as opposed to 75% of non- members - this result has been achieved over the last four years.		
•	18% of students drive to the University.		
•	18% of workers in Macquarie Park live in CoR.		
•	The number of employees coming from the Hills District is significant and will be positively impacted by the new train line.		
•	The average travel time for all employees across the Park is 120mins per day.		
•	This could be decreased by staggering working hours.		
•	1700 people are now "Cohoppers".		
•	The recent remote working trial undertaken at Rouse Hill was well received by workers and management.		
•	There are now 480 extra bus services per week to Macquarie Park.
