4.2	Community Harmony Soccer  Tournament – 22 <sup>nd</sup> March 2014  Hugh advised a similar game was played last year between the Australian Chinese Soccer Team and Eastwood Police.  It was a fund raiser for a police officer who died.  Last year 2 teams took part, this year there are 4. Hopes for 8 next year.  This year's teams are St George Bank, Australian Chinese Soccer Association, Eastwood Police and Korean Soccer Association.  St George Bank are sponsoring the game this year.  Sponsors have been obtained for the trophies, bottled water to be used, lunch and T shirts.	The official name is to be Community Harmony Soccer Tournament.  The committee is welcome to attend the presentation and lunch at the Landmark Hotel.  It was noted that an Indonesian group has expressed an interest in playing next year.
