Misinformation from NSW Government only hurting our suburbs

It is unfortunate that misinformation continues to be spread in our community by the NSW Government regarding the new medium density housing code.

Member for Ryde Victor Dominello claimed in this very newspaper that the City of Ryde currently permits "townhouses, villas and manor houses" and alluded that Council brought these changes on our own community. Mr Dominello's comments are complete nonsense.

Right now, a developer cannot build a block of flats (manor house) in Ryde's R2 low density zones. From 6 July, thanks to the State Government, blocks of flats will be permitted in our R2 low density zones.

The Planning Minister has inserted the definition of "Manor Houses" in our Local Environment Plan via a NSW Government Planning Policy which overrides our local controls.

These blocks of flats will be permitted in our low density zones across our City on 600 square metre lots with a 15 metre frontage, with no meaningful consultation or discussion with Council or our community

Ryde is not North Bondi. Ryde is not Surry Hills. Ryde needs an exemption and we need it now

I am committed to stopping this unwarranted State intervention which will impact the amenity of our suburbs and our environment

Planning Proposal – 17 Acacia Street and 16 Vera Street, Eastwood

A Planning Proposal to amend the planning controls relating to 17 Acacia Street, Eastwood (Lot 69 DP 17583) and 16 Vera Street, Eastwood (Lot 14 DP 26340) will be on public exhibition from 9 May 2018 to 8 June 2018 to seek community comments. The following amendments to the *Ryde Local Environmental Plan 2014* are proposed:

- Amend the Land Zoning Map from SP2 Place of Public Worship to R2 Low Density Residential.
- Amend the Height of Buildings Map to give the land a maximum Building Height of 9.5 metres (the land currently has no height control).
- Amend the Floor Space Ratio Map to give the land a FSR control of 0.5:1 (the land currently has no floor space ratio control)
- Amend the Lot Size Map to include the land into the map requiring a minimum lot size of 580sam.

The Department of Planning and Environment as delegate for the Greater Sydney Commission issued a Gateway Determination on 6 April 2018, which stipulates the public exhibition of the Planning Proposal for a minimum of 14 days in accordance with Section 3.34(2)(c) and Schedule 1 clause 4 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979. Council has been authorised to exercise its functions as the local plan making authority, to make the Plan, by the Department of Planning and Environment as delegate of the Greater Sydney Commission
