New library service will deliver books to your door

I am delighted to announce that we have launched a new library service that will deliver books direct to the homes of library members in the City of Ryde during the COVID-19 outbreak.

The free Library2U service allows members to reserve up to 10 items and then book a delivery window to receive the items.

Reservations for the Library2U service opens today (6 May), with deliveries commencing from Monday 11 May. Members will be able to reserve items by calling 9952 8352 or online at www.ryde.nsw.gov.au/library2u.

In addition, City of Ryde has also expanded the eligibility criteria for its Home Library Service to any City of Ryde resident over 65 years of age.

Traditionally for people who are unable to attend the library due to a disability or illness, the expansion of the Home Library Service recognises that those aged over 65 are some of the most of the vulnerable community members during the COVID-19 outbreak.

All deliveries by City of Ryde Libraries will be contactless and abide by strict social distancing measures that are currently in place.

Council endorses new Financial Hardship Policy

The City of Ryde has endorsed a new Financial Hardship Policy as part of its continued efforts to support those within the community impacted by the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak.

Crucially, this policy ensures that the bulk of support during the COVID-19 crisis goes to the people who need it most.

It will mean eligible pensioners as well as approved Jobseeker and Jobkeeper applicants will qualify for a \$400 council rate rebate.

The policy also allows Council to not charge interest or commence debt recovery on overdue rates for those who qualify for financial hardship.

Council's strong financial position means we can assist those in need during this crisis, and where we can help, we will do so.

Ryde partners with Hunter's Hill to deliver Harris Farm hampers

The City of Ryde is delighted to partner with Hunter's Hill Council to deliver 100 hampers kindly donated by Harris Farm Markets at Boronia Park every weekday to those most in need during the COVID-19 outbreak.
