MAYOR'S COMMUNITY MESSAGE



Meeting with the Korean War Veterans Community

Prior to today's ANZAC Day Commemoration Service, I was fortunate enough to host members of the Korean War Veterans Community along with the President of the Korean Society of Sydney.

During the event we heard from members of the Centenary of ANZAC and WWI Commemoration Committee, including a very touching story from committee member Ayse Dalkic, who is the daughter of a Korean War veteran.

I would like to thank my colleague, Clr Peter Kim, who organised this meeting as it was a great way for the City of Ryde to strengthen the very close ties Council has with our local Korean community.

Ryde says 'Enough is Enough'

Last week I called an Extraordinary Council Meeting in response to the State Government's recently released medium density housing code, which once implemented could result in more than 60% of the Ryde local government area developed as blocks of flats, terraces and duplexes

It is anticipated that the changes to the housing code will mean the number of sites in the City of Ryde capable of being developed for medium density housing will jump from 4,082 to an estimated 14,465

Of greatest concern to Council is the introduction of manor houses to the City's low density zones. These are essentially a block of four flats that, from 6 July, will be able to be built on lots with a 15m frontage and a land area of only 600sqm. The City of Ryde estimates that 10,383 lots will be able to be developed into a block of flats using the code.

Make no mistake, this housing code is yet another attack on Ryde and if it is implemented it will destroy the amenity of our beautiful suburbs.

The City of Ryde had already bore the brunt of Sydney Metropolitan housing targets through State Government Priority Precincts in North Ryde and Macquarie Park. Now the character of our suburbs - the same ones we have fought so hard to protect – is under threat. Enough is enough.

There are two people in NSW who can stop this: the Member for Ryde, the Hon. Victor Dominello, and the Planning Minister, the Hon. Anthony Roberts. Unless they reverse these changes, there will be bulldozers in every street in Ryde.

I am now seeking an urgent meeting with both Mr Roberts and Mr Dominello to seek an exemption to the new housing code and request that Council's own local planning controls prevail over State Government policy.

We will also look at all planning and legal pathways to do what we can to stop 'Developers Day' on 6 July.

The City of Ryde will keep the community regularly updated on the outcome of these discussions as they progress.

Mayor's Morning Tea


Put Saturday 5 May in your diary as the date for the next Mayor's Morning Tea at Waterloo Park in Marsfield.
