Protecting our local waterways

The City of Ryde has become the first Council to commit to a Zero Litter to River target, highlighting once again how committed this Council is to reducing waste and protecting our local environment.

Each year, at least eight million tonnes of plastic flow into the ocean including from rivers, which is equivalent to dumping the contents of one garbage truck into the ocean every minute. As much as 80% of this plastic pollution comes from land-based sources flowing through drains and into local waterways and oceans via stormwater runoff.

The adoption of the Zero Litter to River target means Council will install new stormwater infrastructure, modify existing assets and advocate for stronger regulation as we strive for zero discharge of gross pollutants into local waterways by 2030.

Taking a stand against domestic violence

It is a tragic fact that many people will experience domestic violence at some point in their lifetime.

At the City of Ryde we believe it is our role to not only highlight the impacts of domestic violence but also provide appropriate support where possible to assist victims.

It is for this reason that we will be putting forward a motion at the upcoming Local Government NSW (LGNSW) Conference for LGNSW to lobby the State Government to follow the City of Ryde's lead and

include a 10 day domestic violence leave provision in Local Government Awards.

In addition, the City of Ryde will stage a White Ribbon March later in the year to help raise awareness in the community about domestic violence and what can be done to prevent it occurring.
