



New playground for Anzac Park

To coincide with the recent reopening of playgrounds in the City of Ryde, I am delighted to report that the upgrade to the playground at Anzac Park in West Ryde has now been completed.

This latest playground upgrade was based on extensive consultation with the community and delivers on this Council's promise to invest in new and improved playgrounds that cater to children of all ages.

This new playground includes a range of fun and exciting features that will appeal to children of all ages, including a rope bridge, climbing tower, slides, balancing timber elements and a sandstone water play feature.

As part of the upgrade, the playground was relocated which now allows for existing trees to provide naturally shaded areas for users of the playground.

For the safety of everyone, I encourage everyone who uses the new playground to practice social distancing, good personal hygiene and adhere to the current rules on outdoor gatherings.

Major projects to continue and provide jobs for our City

A motion to initiate a discussion regarding the immediate deferral of all major capital expenditure by the City of Ryde was defeated at an extraordinary meeting this week. The best way out of a global recession and jobs crisis is not through austerity.

The City of Ryde can now focus on working with the State and Federal Governments to create jobs, boost economic growth and invest in vital infrastructure and projects that will help put us back on the road to recovery.

Central to our economic recovery will be the Ryde Central project. This project will sustain over 1000 jobs and once completed will provide a four-fold increase in space for the community. In addition, it will save ratepayers \$2.5 million each year that Council is currently spending to rent office space in North Ryde.

Small Business Hardship Fund

When the first case of coronavirus (COVID-19) emerged in late January, the City of Ryde promised to help businesses get through what was going to be a very challenging period.

Fast forward four months and we have delivered with more than 230 eligible businesses receiving support grants via the City of Ryde's Eastwood Small Business Hardship Fund.

The Hardship Fund was established by Council to assist businesses experiencing significant financial hardship. Eastwood was hit earlier and harder than most small businesses, with disinformation and rumours leading to the usually vibrant shopping precinct resembling a ghost town well before social distancing and lockdown measures were implemented.

These support grants will help more than 230 businesses keep their staff employed and keep their doors open. Crucially, as the economic restrictions start to be lifted, they will help businesses get back on the road to recovery faster.


Small Business Support Package

In addition to the Hardship Fund support grants, Council has also implemented a Small Business Support Package to support local businesses during the COVID-19 outbreak and assist in business recovery during the post-pandemic phase.

Under the Small Business Support package more than 40 different fees and charges will be waived for six months.

In addition, Council will also negotiate financial assistance support for café and restaurant owners operating from Council premises and other commercial tenants of Council. These negotiations will be undertaken on a case-by-case basis to develop a tailored solution for each tenant and may include rent waivers, rent deferrals or lease extensions.
