Council provides financial relief for sporting clubs

In a huge win for community sports in the City of Ryde, Council will waive ground hire and sports field lighting costs upon application for the remainder of the 2020 winter sports season.

The unanimous decision by Council will help local sporting clubs recover from the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, which has resulted in the suspension of all community sport since March.

In addition, Council also unanimously resolved to extend the 2020 winter sports season to mid-October and to activate the lighting at some sports grounds to allow for weekday night games where permissible.

With community sport allowed to return this week, these measures introduced by Council will help local sporting clubs resume play and get locals back participating in the activities that they enjoy.

Since the COVID-19 pandemic begun, Council has worked hard to provide support to those who need it, and this latest round of financial relief for the local sporting community does exactly that.

Medium Density Housing Code comes into effect

Despite our community's and Council's opposition the State Government's Medium Density Housing Code comes into effect in the City of Ryde this week.

This code will allow multi-dwelling houses such as small blocks of flats and dual occupancy dwellings to be built in the City of Ryde's low-density residential neighbourhoods for the first time. It will also allow for these multi-dwelling developments to be approved by private certifiers, with no requirement for objections to be considered.

As many would know, Council has been opposed to this

code from the beginning, as it has the potential to overhaul our low-density residential neighbourhoods (approximately 60 percent of the local government area) with inappropriate developments.

To help overcome this, Council has developed a planning proposal, which would prevent the approval of multi-dwelling developments and manage the number and location of dual occupancy developments in our low-density residential neighbourhoods.

Given the serious impact this code could have on our community, I once again call on NSW Planning Minister Rob Stokes to defer the code for as long as it takes for the State Government to approve the planning proposal.

If this does not occur, we run the real risk of bulldozers popping up in our quiet streets over the coming weeks and months.

Extended hours for Customer Service Centre and libraries

With the further easing of COVID-19 restrictions, I am happy to report that opening hours for the City of Ryde's Customer Service Centre and libraries, as well as library visiting hours will increase.

Starting this week, the Customer Service Centre is open from 10.00am to 5.00pm, Monday to Friday.

Visiting times at all five library branches will increase to 30 minutes. All libraries are open 10am to 5pm, Monday to Friday, except for Gladesville Library which is open 1.00pm to 5.00pm, Tuesday to Thursday and 9.00am to 1.30pm on Fridays.
