New Procurement Policy

That is why I am delighted to report that the City of Ryde has endorsed a new procurement policy that will not only support the local economy, but also promote greater sustainability practices.

Under the new policy, Council will consider the use of local suppliers wherever possible when assessing potential supplier relationships. This will not only encourage economic development in the City of Ryde but also help support job creation.

In addition, the policy also establishes sustainable operational targets that will require 50 percent of all material procurements to be sourced from recycled material by 2025, helping Council continue to achieve positive environmental outcomes for the Ryde community.

Eastwood Threads

You may have noticed a range of eye-catching flags located throughout Eastwood town centre at the moment.

These flags are part of the Eastwood Threads project, which has been undertaken by the City of Ryde in partnership with community organisation CASS.

Eastwood-based artist Chris Yee threaded these diverse artworks together, creating digital tapestries which form the basis for the design of each flag currently on display in Eastwood.

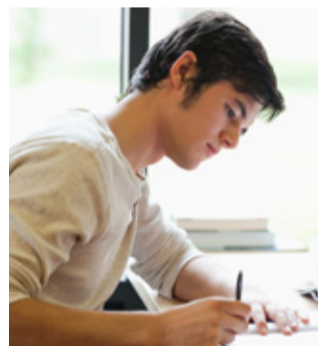
