Councils should always reflect the communities they represent and if we want the City of Ryde to be a true representation of our community, then we need more female representation on our Council.

Women make up half the population in the City of Ryde, yet only two of our 12 Councillors are female.

This latest State Government initiative builds on the work the City of Ryde has done in recent years to promote inclusion and encourage people to contribute to the running of Council. This includes becoming one of the first councils to provide childcare for members of our advisory committees when meetings are held.

The City of Ryde stands united with our local Armenian-Australian community following the resumption of hostilities in the Republic of Artsakh/Nagorno-Karabakh.

As part of a Council resolution, the City of Ryde has condemned the military aggression launched by Azerbaijan and Turkey against the right of self-determination of the indigenous Armenian population of Artsakh.

Council also held a minute's silence in honour of those who have lost their lives in the conflict and called on the Federal Government to request an immediate ceasefire and end to the hostilities.

I would like to thank all Councillors who supported this resolution, in particular Clr Sarkis Yedelian OAM for all his work in representing the interests of the Armenian community in Ryde.
