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Executive Summary & Background

The City of Ryde has developed a draft Masterplan for Blenheim Park. A Masterplan provides the framework for how the park will be upgraded over the next 20 years. This strategic plan aims to meet the current and future needs of the community and user groups, while ensuring sustainable and efficient use and ecological outcomes.

The park currently includes a playground, walking and cycling paths, a fenced dog off-leash area, amenities building, picnic and BBQ facilities, a radio control car track and a car park.

Stage 1 community consultation was conducted from 20 February to 17 March 2019, during which the community provided feedback on the existing park and what they would like to see in the park in the future. Council used this initial stage of feedback to develop a draft Masterplan for the site which was presented to the community for further feedback through Stage 2 community consultation.

The City of Ryde's internal community engagement team conducted Stage 2 community consultation process to gather feedback from the community on the draft Masterplan design for Blenheim Park. The draft Masterplan included an upgraded regional playground, walking and cycling paths, picnic and BBQ facilities, new active recreation area, new fenced dog-off leash area, new radio control track, fitness equipment, improved parking, recreation areas and other general park improvements.


Stage 2 community consultation was conducted from 5 February to 1 March 2020 during which the community could complete an online interactive map and ask questions or provide feedback at one of the drop-in sessions. This was promoted through City of Ryde's Have Your Say website, flyers to surrounding residents, an eNewsletter to stakeholders, signage in the park and advertisements in the local newspapers and social media.

In total 363 comments were received from the community with 192 comments from the drop-in sessions, 165 comments via the online interactive map and 6 email submissions.

Through the Stage 2 community consultation, positive feedback was typically received on the draft Masterplan design, with key favourable elements being the radio control car club upgrade and the active recreation area. While the upgrading of the radio control car track was favourable, many users expressed concerns regarding the size of the track and space dedicated to support facilities. Concerns were also expressed by users of the dog park regarding the location, size and fence height of the new dog off leash area.

The feedback from this Stage 2 community consultation will be used to inform the final Masterplan for Blenheim Park, which will be reported to Council for adoption in 2020.

KEY CONSIDERATIONS

Based on the feedback received the key themes on the draft Blenheim Park Masterplan are (in alphabetical order):

- Access and paths: Some respondents expressed they would like to see external
 connections to the park strengthened. Suggestions included bridge or more direct route
 across Epping Road connecting to train station/buses and connections from the southern
 side of the park. Suggestions for pathways within the park included learn to ride tracks,
 meterage markers, level pathways and bush track through Myall Reserve.
- Active recreation: Respondents provided positive comments on the active recreation space generally, regarding the fitness stations, multi-use/basketball courts, skate park and rebound wall.
 - Specific suggestions for equipment in the skate park included rails, mini bowl, snake bowl, pyramid/triangle jumps and to cater for different skill levels and ages. Regarding the courts, comments also noted to include lighting and line markings for other sports (netball, handball and tennis).
- **Dog park:** Many comments regarding the new dog park expressed concerns including location, due to the proximity to other facilities (e.g. playground and skate park), proximity to the main road, traffic noise and preferring the current or a different location. Other concerns included the fence height and size of the new dog off leash area.
 - Users would also like to see adequate shading and seating, double gates, water stations for dog owners and general maintenance of the area. Some positive comments were also received, noting respondents liked the new features and the dog park generally.
- Environment and bio-diversity: Many comments noted the importance and liked the
 environmental components of the park such as needing more trees/plants, preserving
 trees, natives and animal friendly plants, like the bio-diversity corridors, bush kindy,
 maintenance, animal crossing points and a community garden.
- **General comments:** Some respondents indicated that they like the Masterplan and the expansion of the park generally. Requests also included the dog park, multi-use courts and the playground being areas of priority for delivery.
- **Parking:** Comments noted the need for more parking and indicated that respondents like the new parking configuration on Blenheim Road.
- **Picnic areas:** Respondents liked the inclusion of picnic areas (including BBQs) and also noted that picnic areas and park bench seating should be available throughout the park.

KEY CONSIDERATIONS

- **Playground:** Most frequently, comments regarding the regional playground concept mentioned the inclusion of water play, the need for adequate shade in this area of the park and general positive comments. Specific features respondents would like to see include nature play, fencing, longer slides, maintaining the flying fox, combo units, inclusion and exclusion of the sandpit, climbing elements and use of recycled materials.
- Open space and park greens: While a few respondents noted they like the open space included in the Masterplan, others noted open spaces are currently not used within the park and would be wasted space.
- Other amenities and facilities: Many comments noted the need for adequate shade, lighting and seating throughout the park generally and with comments relating to specific areas in the park. Other comments suggested additional/upgraded toilet, the inclusion of a café (onsite or van), water stations, noise barriers and cricket nets.
- Radio control car club: Generally, comments noted the importance of the radio control
 car club and indicated that respondents were happy to see the facilities included in the
 masterplan and being upgraded. However, many comments expressed concerns over
 the size of the proposed facilities. Respondents noted that to meet demand, the facility
 should be no smaller than the current facility and if possible larger, with adequate space
 (and potentially undercover) for a pit area.


Additionally, comments noted the importance of ensuring the facility and stand are designed to be accessible/inclusive for all users and the need for adequate support amenities (lighting, shade, power). A few comments also noted that access to the radio control car facilities from the carpark is important (e.g. unloading equipment and disability access), while a few others questioned why the facility is being moved as it could be upgraded in its current location.






SOCIAL PIN-POINT RESULTS


FEEDBACK ON THE DRAFT MASTERPLAN OVERALL











Comment

10m offset between playground + dog off leash area.

2 size dog parks similar to Blackman park lane cove. This is great for dogs learning social skills, seperate big/small dags

2x ovals/green are unnecessary. Hill top green could be vegetation rather than grass.

A bit of shade for the playground would be great. It gets really got during the day especially in Summer. Will the playground be fenced or at least partially fenced? Children being in close proximity to many dogs going to the dog park is a concern as many dogs will not be on a leash.

A drinking tap for humans as well as dogs inside the dog park.

A great asset to the local area.

Suggestion to marginally improve the lighting facilities and to establish a disability capable drivers stand. There are a number of existing disabled people who compete in RC.

And RC in general allows people with a physical disability to compete at an even capacity to an able bodied person.

A little more space would be helpful. RC Racing here is usually well attended.

A new divers stand similar to that at Castle Hill RC Club would be far safer and would allow access for wheel chair bound competitors. The Castle Hill council has embraced the sport and have help to develop the facilities. It would be nice to see Ryde Council do the same.

A water play area would be a great addition. Please ensure that there's plenty of shade, it can get quite hot in summer.

A wheelchair stand would enable me as a wheelchair user to compete in a sport

Access to power in the dog park (locked key system) on a register.

Active rescreation area

Add a board at the entrance to the car park saying that the track is here. This informs more people crating an attractive space for people to come to. This can draw more people in and make the park more interactive as a whole

Add an overbridge to make crossing Epping Road safer.

Add solar panels and rainwater harvesting to the drivers stand and race control

An upgrade to the radio control car track is not only beneficial to the direct users of it, but also the whole park. Kids who are attending bbq's in the park love coming and watching the cars, and it is the only facility in the park which is maintained by those whom use it.

VERBATIM COMMENTS

Comment (continued)

(Organisation) strongly supports the City of Ryde's investment in Blenheim Park, and the plans to improve this vital green space. We strongly support Council's proposal to improvement connectivity with the area by improving walking and cycling paths to and through the park.

We note the ongoing challenges presented by the volume of single occupancy car commuters in the area, and commuters parking in spaces intended for local and recreational use. Blenheim Road is currently an exception in the local road network as it is unrestricted, with no parking controls applied. Council's own parking survey at the site found a weekday parking space occupancy rate of 83% to 94%. Council's experience at the recently renovated Christie Park, to the north of the business area, found commuters parking in the park for more than three hours hindered its use by sports teams and other genuine uses. We note Council's intention to change parking on Blenheim Road to 90* angle spaces. We encourage Council to make all parking inside Blenheim Park consistent, and limited to a maximum of 3 hours on weekdays (resident permits excepted), to discourage misuse of this space and to reduce congestion in the local area.

(Organisation) would be happy to help communicate these changes with the local business community in due course.

Masterplan suggestions

(Organisation) wishes to make the following suggestions on the proposed park designs:

- Install well-lit and secure bicycle storage, particularly at the park's Epping Road entrances which are bordered by a key regional cycling route. **Consider a recreational off road bicycle trail through the trees which form the perimeter of the park. This facility could be reached independently by young people from the local area by using the Epping Road regional cycleway, which is traffic-free.
- Create a continuous footway across the Blenheim Road entrance to improve safety for park users on foot and by bicycle, particularly if the above suggested bike trail continues to the native vegetation area in the east of the park.
- Install speed control measures, such as speed bumps or speed tables, along the Blenheim Road parking area, to improve safety and ensure speeds are consistent with the area's intended use.

We look forward to seeing the evolution and improvement of this excellent asset for our local area.

Currently this area is rarely used. It is either too hot, too wet or poorly maintained. Instead of putting in another open wasted space, why not put in a water feature for the children and the suggested cricket nets etc. The other advantage of putting this sort of thing here is that the parents can keep an eye on their children which they can't do in the proposed new area. The money saved by improving this area rather than increasing unused space can be better spent elsewhere.

Disabled access and shaded areas would be greatly appreciated for the public to enjoy the great club of Sydney RC!

Disabled access is great as there a number of racers confined to wheelchairs that previously were disadvantaged.

I don't think this area is big enough. Car access to close to the track area is also preferred. The club also holds several major events each year that require additional parking of full size vehicles.

I first went to this track 29 years ago and I'm thrilled that the plan is to keep the track and hopefully improve it, but as others have said the size of the area is important and needs to be at least the size of the current area - if not bigger - fyi people currently use the area outside of the fenced track to pit. Better lighting would also be welcome. Its a great opportunity to build a first class track that people in Sydney will enjoy for years to come. I have a couple of points worth noting...

- 1) This area looks significantly smaller than the already small current area. Any smaller than current will simply not work.
- 2) It would be awesome to include a covered pit area and lockable race control doing so would require less footprint
- 3) This track currently brings great family value and entertainment to the Ryde district don't stuff it up! I have been reading comments on the use of a soft rubber material for the ground. Please do not do this. I have played on outdoor basketball courts all my life and recommend a hard surface (such as a hard court tennis court) similar to what Hornsby council have done at Erlestoke Park in Cherrybrook.

Please do not use rubber as it is slow to dry and very slippery when wet.

In order to reduce maintenance on the backboard, use a high quality material, not wood as it will deteriorate over time.

I like every aspect of the master plan. Go to it!

I love that the skate park is included because local kids can walk or skate there rather than having to drive to Meadowbank. I like how the bowl has a rise in the middle and how there appears to be a quarter pipe.

I love that there will be an agility area for all the dogs, the more interesting things for the puppies to explore the better!

Please also make sure there is shade/ covered area and a water fountain for people.

I would also prefer that the dog park is further away from the main road, as a dog scared by traffic noise has the potential to be guite dangerous, to other dogs and people.

I love the plan for the park. It looks fabulous. It would be good if you could included water-guns in the water play area and some bird and bee-friendly plants around the park. It is important that the dog park has two entrances so that (if need be) an unfriendly dog can leave when a small dog arrives.

I really like the playground

I suggest that the skate park has a snake bowl with different heights so you can choose where to drop in because some skaters might be more confident than others. I think that there should be a pyramid jump or a triangle jump for skaters who want to practice jumping. I also suggest some shaded seats around the outside so that parents can watch younger children skate.

I suggest the skate park has a separate area for younger children to skate with lower ramps. Also so they don't get overwhelmed with older or more advanced skaters.

The size of the existing track is really the minimum possible. Please ensure the proposed facility is at least as large as the existing facility. For further suggestions, please consult with the club that does such an excellent job of maintaining the facility for visitors such as us.

I write in general support of the Blenheim Park Masterplan and believe the City of Ryde Council is to be congratulated for its general support of the expansion and well-considered development of this parkland. However, I wish to highlight a few matters arising from a perusal of the Draft Masterplan Report:

1. In the section, Opportunities and Constraints, there is mention of thinning target areas of planting. Thinning is not a good idea because, the thicker the plantings of native flora, the better the biodiversity opportunities that exist for small birds and other native fauna. There are other advantages of retaining thickets:

• less maintenance in terms of mowing and cleaning would be needed

• trees planted more closely give more support to each other in windy conditions

• thickly planted areas are of value for air filtering and cleaning

- 2. Opportunity to introduce broad canopy park trees•is a good idea. Hopefully suitable local native species will be chosen that do not drop branches.
- 3. It is noted that additional trees should be planted to reduce the traffic noise from Epping Road. Trees of themselves do not attenuate noise. Sound barriers and soil mounds do, so
- 4. If there are to be mounds of soil, they should be of uncontaminated clay (from Wianamatta Shale) to maintain consistency with Sydney Turpentine Ironbark Forest which was the original ecological community in this location. And indigenous plants and trees should be used.
- 5. The plan calls for a cohesive planting with contemporary native mixes of shrubs and groundcovers, broad canopy park trees and clumps of densely planted natives to achieve improved bio-diversity and habitat corridor connections. I trust that this means planting will be restricted to indigenous or endemic species. Thank you for the opportunity to make this submission, which I trust will be helpful in achieving the best possible outcomes for Blenheim Park.

If noise is a problem for any residents backing onto the park, why not plant a barrier of large shrubs or small bushy trees such as Lilli Pillis to act as a sound barrier. There will always be noise during the day - dogs, children, Epping Rd - all of which are noisy during the day. There are no dogs or children there at night!!! If you want to even double the visitors to the park you will need another toilet block. On busy days this one can barely cope.

Imrpove connection over or under Epping Road to train station

In today's world our youth are immersed in technology and indoor activity. The development of Blenheim Park is missing a vital ingredient for our children - Nature Play.

As suggested #7DE249 a space for a Community "Bush Kindy" provides our youth the opportunity to explore, problem solve, learn about our environment, in a minimal infrastructure and non-facilitated format. An environment where our children are able to take calculated risks.

I propose Blenheim Park has a enclosed space that can operate as a Community Bush Kindy. A place of play sessions where families can bond with their community through making mud pies, building tee-pees from sticks and branches, exploring bush craft, and learning about our local indigenous community.

I hope this makes sense, please feel free to email or call to expand on the concept if required. i'm looking forward to seeing an expanded and rejuvenated park that encourages children to be both active and challenged.

I am pleased the council has responded to community needs and wishes about the park. My main concern about this upgrade is the preservation of the natural environment and existing trees, particularly old and established trees, within the park. I would like to see all bush and tress that are already in the park protected. Will this be the case?

The area designated for RC racing isnt large enough.

If this is to be done properly the track should be as large or bigger than the original track.

The area in the map if to scale looks quite small vs the current track area. I'd request that the club is consulted to obtain the ideal track/pit area size.

We currently have a permit to use water to keep dust down and provide an ideal surface to race

The area looks too small, Maybe get the clubs input in regard to lighting, cover and possibly an all weather, low maintenance surface, We have an opportunity to build on the clubs great history, stable management and passionate members/users and create a world class RC venue

The carpark area needs to be larger with the road below epping road level you could probably put in a three level capark. This would give more area to the park and as many cars park there during the week to catch the train it would also double for that.

When ever anything is built there is never enough parking provided with the development.

The Dog Park is currently used by more dogs than there are children/adults in the play area on any day. To help with the noise maybe a solid wall could be built along the back perimeter.

More people with dogs have moved into the units across the road that have their own play areas for children.

The dog park should not be next to Epping Road. Dogs have previously jumped the fence and headed for Epping Road. This would be catastrophic for humans and dogs.

The initial drawing shows what appears to be a reduced are from the current site. The track as it currently stands would not want to be any smaller. I recommend maintains the size it slightly larger.

Additionally I can not see an area marked for the RC drivers stand (elevated platform).

Ideally the drivers stand should be 2 meters minimum and able to have 12 drives shoulder to shoulder comfortably. The stand (or alternate track side building should house permanent race control facilities.

The kick around/oval spaces are great.

The majority of apartment dwellers are working couples or families with preschool children. There are more dogs than children. All the blocks have park space for the kids, but no area where dogs can go off leash. Many are allowed off leash in these spaces which is illegal and could be dangerous for children and dogs. Many of these owners won't come to Blenheim park because it is too small and therefore over crowded. Enlarging the off leash area would help this problem.

The Masterplan looks amazing! So grateful our council are doing great things like this!! Our main feedback/guestions..

- will the radio car park be free
- will there be a more detailed skate park plan available? We think a skate park catering for different skills will be good eg. Tathra Skate park

The new area for the radio control car track looks a little small. When you consider it attracts users for all over the state (track will hold the state championships in 2020), and a world class track could be created with this opportunity. I am also unsure if the location is the greatest, the track is very susceptible to vandalism so perhaps a little less obvious location would be preferred? This proposed area is NOT large enough for the activities performed here. It seems to be around 50% of the current area. due to the high demand for use of the track and the scale of events held here, this reduction of space will have a negative effect on users and restrict any growth.

This RC facility is such an important part of the community. With a heritage of over 35 years it has provided enjoyment for the young and old for many years.

So important to retain at minimum the current facility size to ensure the continuation of the club. I'm not sure this location is appropriate.

Love the proposal for a new drivers stand with wheelchair access. Love the proposal for a new pitting area. Ideally this should have a permanent roof established.

This RC off road track has been in place for many years, providing an excellent venue where enthusiasts can compete with both local out of town competitors. To downgrade or compromise this venue would leave a gap in the available sports venues, in particular family based venues, for the lower north shore area.

This space seems small compared to the current track location. The RC club/track is an awesome social entity that brings together people from all over Sydney. There is a great family vibe with many parent/child race teams.

Where is the Kiosk?

While I appreciate the additional features proposed, I am completely dissatisfied with the relocation of the off-leash area from its present location.

The dog-park users originally suggested the southwards extension of the current area; this site allows access directly from Blenheim Road or the carpark without having to walk dogs through areas where children and dog-phobic adults are roaming freely.

Why are we moving the existing track its in a good location and the size is about the smallest it can be already. The existing track is already quite small. Any smaller and racing events will not be inviting. The reason the track is in a good location in terms of overall park is that is a quite noisy location in terms of traffic noise from the main road, which makes it less desirable for any other activities.

The main issue is the new plan is too small for an effective rc track.

Why not leave the radio car track where it is, leave the dog park where it is, move the new netball courts etc to where you have put the new car track, and move the car park to where you have the proposed netball courts.
