The **One Drop Festival** will be held on Saturday June 25 at Eden Gardens, Cnr Lane Cove and Fontenoy Road, North Ryde, from 10.00am – 3.00pm. The event is a partnership of the Councils of the City of Ryde, Hornsby and Hunters Hill and Eden Gardens.

The One Drop Festival is part of the Catchment Connections program and has been designed to showcase the positive environmental initiatives taking place throughout the three Council areas especially relating to water management and use.

Featured will be lectures on a host of environmental topics such as water issues in the catchment area, rainwater tanks and solar hot water systems, chemical free cleaning and sustainable home renovation.

#### CATCHMENT CONNECTIONS PROGRAM

Catchment Connections is a three year project which aims to improve the water quality of local creeks, preserve and enhance remnant bushland areas, improve local biodiversity and increase community involvement in Bushcare activities.

Catchment Connections covers over 2,000 hectares (20 km<sup>2</sup>) across the Terrys Creek, Mars Creek, Shrimptons Creek and Buffalo Creek catchments, which are all tributaries of the Lane Cove River. The project commenced in 2008 and is run in partnership with City of Ryde, Hornsby Shire and Hunters Hill Councils and funded by the NSW Environmental Trust.

#### **BIOS – ECO LECTURES**

#### Assoc Prof. Phil McManus, Sydney University, School of Geosciences

Phil is a senior lecturer in the School of Geosciences and coordinator of environmental science at The University of Sydney. He is the author of Vortex Cities to Sustainable Cities: Australia's Urban Challenge (UNSW Press, 2005) and several other publications. His current research focuses on sustainable cities, urban forestry and representations of nature in the construction of a range of environmental issues. He combines urban environmental history with policy and planning research that is future-oriented.

#### **Frances Bodkin**

Frances is a 76 year old D'harawal elder from the south of Sydney. She teaches traditional Indigenous 'science' and enables a deeper understanding of, and an ability to care for, our natural environment. She is also a Western scientist with degrees in climatology, geomorphology and environmental science. With traditional understanding and her countless degrees, she has a truly holistic approach to understanding our environment. Fran teaches using creative story-telling and works as a nature guide at Mt Annan Botanic Gardens.

#### Sam Cappelli - Manager Environment, City of Ryde

Sam Cappelli, Manager, the Environment, City of Ryde has an excess of 29 years experience in local government working in the areas of environmental health and building control, environmental and resource management and climate change mitigation and adaptation, particularly in developing key policies and standards. He has held senior positions at Holroyd, Strathfield and now Ryde Councils. Since 2004, he has been actively involved in the catchment management related areas of sustainable transport, water sensitive urban design, sustainable procurement, environmental education and incorporating sustainability into planning controls for the City of Ryde to ensure projects meet an acceptable level of sustainability across the quadruple bottom line indicators relevant to the City of Ryde.

# Matt Springall - Senior Field Officer, Lane Cove National Park, National Parks and Wildlife Service

Matt Springall has been working in the ecological restoration industry for 17 years, working with Bushcare volunteers, bush regeneration companies and local and state government. He is currently the Senior Field Officer (Bush Regeneration) at Lane Cove National Park, and is the Vice President of the Australian Association of Bush Regenerators (NSW) Inc.

#### Cameron Little, Director, Sustainability Systems & Services

Has nearly two decades experience in the field of sustainability, and has extensive specialised knowledge in relation to the provision of environmental education and support that leads to tangible improvements. Sustainability Systems & Services works with a range of public and private sector organisations to help them understand how the principles of sustainability relate to their business, and how to establish and maintain environmental management systems and sustainable business practices and strategies for creating positive change.

#### Cameron Rosen, Architect, Building Manager and Director of Australian Living

Cameron Rosen (B.Building, UNSW) has been building and renovating residential, retail and corporate premises since 1992. Cameron has a strong desire to see the building industry move from traditonal to sustainable techniques. #### **Mic Conway**

Mic Conway has been a stalwart of the Australian live music scene for many years, performing in the seminal 'Captain Matchbox Whoopee Band' and recently Mic Conway's National Junk Band. Mic Conway will be presenting his very special show '*Rubbish*' at the One Drop Festival. The show is a highly original performance about the three R's: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and features junk musical instruments, magical trash, juggling, newspaper ripping, puppetry, singing and dancing. *Rubbish* has been designed to introduce children to ideas such as composting, saving water and electricity, separating rubbish, recycling and more.

#### Tapstar show featuring Tapstar & Dripette

"Tapstar Saves Water" focuses on a typical Australian family and their use of water around the house. Tapstar, with the help of the kids, shows the right way for the family to become Water Wise graduates with the assistance of the children in the audience. The performance incorporates singing, scientific demonstrations, and audience participation to get the water conservation messages through to a young audience in a fun and engaging way.

#### Australian Wildlife Displays

Hosted by wildlife expert Anthony Stimson and featuring animals such as Snappy the Crocodile, Blossom the Possum and Princess the Diamond Python, the Sydney's Child Wildlife Show will introduce children to Australia's unique and varied wildlife. The show is a great way for children to see Australia's native wildlife up close while learning about the many ways we can all help to protect Australia's diverse species and their natural habitat

#### King and Queen of Green

The King and Queen Rule over the land of Green and travel about reminding people that we can all make a difference to the planet by doing simple things at home work and school. Their royal majesties use whacky machinery and scientific demonstrations to help show children that everything we do has an effect on the planet and that there are simple ways they can make a difference. During the show they will explore some topics the children can all relate to including Transport, Energy use, Saving Water and Waste. There are many opportunities for the children to get involved from getting up on stage or singing along and doing the actions to their environmentally friendly songs.

#### The Last Drop

Presented by Leapfish - The Last Drop is an interactive theatre performance and workshop program about water, the weather and our future. A gypsy and an inventor travel through time to understand our changing weather and where we are heading in the future. The Last Drop is a non-didactic, fun and engrossing performance about the water crisis facing the world today.

#### Supa Cycla

Supercycla is a real life recycling superhero who facilitates both workshops and live performances in order to teach children the benefits of living sustainably through songs, plays, and fun activities.

#### **Circus Solarus**

Circus Solarus is an eco themed, solar-powered theatre group whose style has its origins in pre-circus European Carnival - irreverent and physical, with improvised interaction with the public. The company is committed to transforming the everyday public space through street theatre and lively comic performances.

#### My Sauce Good
