KIDS GO ACTIVE 2 SCHOOL AT MEADOWBANK PUBLIC

The City of Ryde Go Active2School walking program will be launched at Meadowbank Public School on Friday 24 May at a Walk Safely to School Day breakfast for students and parents.

Two hundred Go Active2School packs will be given out to students to help them get started. The information packs in English, Chinese and Korean, include:

- Transport Access Guides (TAG) maps of safe local walking routes
- Information leaflets on -
 - Pedestrian and traffic light crossings
 - o Libraries and shopping centres
 - Being sun smart healthy living
- Go Active2School reflective bag tag
- New Travel Chart so kids can keep track of their activity as they travel to and from school.

Working with the Council's project team, members of the Meadowbank Public School community conducted a 'walkability' audit in surrounding streets to map the School's best access routes and identify any potential hazards.

City of Ryde Mayor, Clr Ivan Petch, said: "Walking safely to school with a parent, family members or friends is a great way for children to keep active and stay healthy.

"I congratulate the School for taking action to help kids get more active with this easy program and urge all parents to familiarise themselves with the literature."
