New Grant Categories

The revamped format offers new categories provide better opportunities for applicants to identify a grant that best suits their objectives. There are six new categories offering grants ranging from \$2,000 up to \$5,000.

These categories are:

- Seniors Grant (up to \$2,000) this new grant category is for local seniors groups for projects that will enhance existing programs or encourage new activities.
- **Capacity Building Grant** 3 sub categories (up to \$3,500) this category is for all groups to help boost organisation growth potential and realise its vision. There are three sub-categories covering Events, Emerging Groups and a General section which includes Arts and Culture.
- **Sports and Recreation Grant (up to \$3,500)** for local sporting and recreation groups to develop activities that increase the opportunity for participation in sports, recreation and physical activity.
- **Community Projects Grant (up to \$5,000)** these grants will support special projects aim at working towards building a cohesive and connected community, based on inclusion, enhancing community well-being and cultural growth.
