Surf Ryder Wins NSW Project of the Year Award

Ryde Council's Surf Ryder project management team has won two prestigious awards at the 2015 Australian Institute of Project Management (AIPM) Achievement Awards, including the hotly contested NSW Project of the Year. <u>View all winners</u>.

The Council also took out the AIPM Award in the NSW Community and/or Development category for the Surf Ryder from highly established organisations such as Sydney Trains, Broadcast Australia, AGL and NSW Public Works.

Both Awards recognise best practice in project management for works undertaken on the installation of the Surf Ryder and Forecourt Construction at the Ryde Aquatic Leisure Centre (RALC).

The \$3.5 million Surf Ryder is the State's first community owned surf attraction. It was delivered on time and within budget by a team collaboration across all units of the Council. It was fully funded from RALC reserves, at no cost to the community.

The Mayor, Clr Bill Pickering, said: "The AIPM excellence awards represent an outstanding achievement for the City of Ryde, its residents and the broader community.

"Congratulations to the staff who have once again demonstrated their skills and high level of professionalism in delivering this outstanding community asset that is enjoyed by so many."

As the NSW AIPM Project of the Year winner, City of Ryde's Surf Ryder will be up against other State recipients of the Award included Queensland Police Service for *G20 – Global Summit (Brisbane)*, Department of Infrastructure NT Government

for *Cyclone Recovery Works Phase One* and Public Transport Authority of WA. The National Awards will be announced in October 2015.

Ryde Aquatic Leisure Centre (RALC) swim instructor Jason Smylie has been named AUSTSWIM National Swim Teacher of the Year Access and Inclusion, for his work with children with special needs.

The AUSTSWIM Excellence Award is the nation's highest award, recognising teachers who excel in aquatic education.

Jason Smylie has been teaching children with special needs at the RALC for seven years, passing on vital swimming, survival and participation skills.

City of Ryde Mayor, Clr Bill Pickering, said it is a great thrill that a local teacher has been acknowledged as being the best in Australia and is an indication of the professionalism of staff. "It's obvious that Jason is totally dedicated to his pupils and loves his job.

"The community is better off because of Jason's commitment and contribution to swimming and water safety.

"Teachers like Jason are making a huge difference teaching Ryde kids of all abilities how to enjoy the water safely," he said.

Jason Smylie said he was honoured to receive the award. "I wouldn't be where I am today without the assistance of my colleagues, students and parents. They mean so much to me. I just want to thank them for their support and trust in me," he said.

Ryde Aquatic Leisure Centre Manager, Paul Hartman, said Jason continually tried to improve his skills with aquatic industry qualifications.

"He can identify student needs and implement programs that cater for each individual child's ability. He works inclusively with parents and students and believes a collaborative effort is important.

"Jason is always looking for what's new in the aquatics industry and is a wonderful example of how dedicated and knowledgeable all our staff at the RALC are."

In 2013 Jason Smylie was also named the NSW Teacher of Aquatics to People with a Disability by AUSTSWIM.

In recent years, Ryde Aquatic Leisure Centre staff have been recognised with several AUSTSWIM Awards including Swim School of the Year.

The AUSTSWIM accreditation is the industry standard for Swimming and Water Safety Teachers[™] and is delivered and recognised in each state and territory of Australia and many countries overseas. There are currently over 32,000 AUSTSWIM Teachers in Australia and internationally with over 10,000 licensed in teaching specific programs such as infants, people with a disability and adults.

"The work was thorough, thoughtful and showed mature handling of what can only be described as a complex subject in seeking a mandate from residents to increase rates over and above the annual rate peg.

"This, combined with intelligent planning, excellent stakeholder engagement and analysis, and a clear concise publication with plain English wording, resulted in a project that significantly over-achieved its communications and end-result goals.

"I congratulate our talented and professional staff for their outstanding work. Their efforts have ensured that Council has secured long-term financial sustainability for current and future generations" Clr Pickering said.

Local Government NSW Awards are held annually to recognise outstanding examples of communication excellence and community reporting in line with best practice standards. They are presented to those organisations and communicators who have achieved outstanding success from innovative and effective communication practices in the local government sector.

Local Government NSW judges described the City of Ryde's entry as "a well thought out campaign and a strong communication message for what is a hard topic to inform on and especially engage about. Ryde showed great innovation and one of the stand-outs was the educational video that delivered a complicated topic in a clear message and made it interesting and relevant."

City of Ryde General Manager Gail Connolly said the SRV was a difficult and complicated message to take to a diverse audience with complex communications needs. "Our staff did a brilliant job, working across all units of Council to streamline messaging, consolidate resources and package communications so that it was understood by all.

"The positive feedback Council received from a large section of the community, the success in securing the support of residents and the ultimate granting of a Special Rate Increase by IPART was the result we were seeking. The receipt of this Award is further testament to the quality of our staff who work with limited resources, very tight budgets and generally in very restricted timeframes. We are indeed proud of the result."
