Gladesville Library Gets \$160K Upgrade

Gladesville Library is having a makeover and will reopen with a fresh new look on Monday 5 December, in time for the holiday season.

The \$160,000 refurbishment includes new carpets, paint, a contemporary colour scheme and a new interior layout. Innovations include a youth collection area and a zone for public computers and printing facilities, along with new WiFi and mobile printing facilities. In addition, programmed maintenance to the exterior of the building is being done while the refurbishment is in progress.

City of Ryde Mayor said: "Gladesville Library has been offering a great service and range of popular programs for sixty years and is highly valued by the community.

"The new layout and interior reflect the transformation of libraries from traditional quiet places of reading and study into vibrant community hubs that cater for a range of people and services."

Gladesville Library has a unique place in the history of libraries in the area due to the Joint Library Agreement between City of Ryde and Hunters Hill Council. The Agreement has been in place since 1957 and was most recently renewed in 2014.

A special celebration is planned for Saturday 10 December, 9.30am – 12 noon, when the Mayor of Ryde Clr Bill Pickering is joined by Hunters Hill Mayor Clr Richard Quinn for a cake-cutting morning tea. Everyone is invited to enjoy the fun, entertainment and refreshments, which include:

- a 'giant' storybook Storytime session
- visit from the Gladesville Fire Brigade
- free face painting and craft activities
- special performances by local groups including the Riverside Girls High String Quartet, the Villa Maria Catholic School Choir and the Joubert Singers.

Facts and Stats about Gladesville Library

Gladesville Library opened in 1956. It has been a joint service with Hunters Hills Council since 1957.

62,000 visitors passed through its doors 2015/16 year and is tracking towards an increase in visitors of 14.3% for the 2016/2017 financial year.

Programs and services include computer access, free WiFi, DVDs, children's books, HSC material, Chinese language items, Rhymetime 0-2 yo, Storytime 3-5 yo, First Monday knitting group, book clubs, author talks.

Fiction and non-fiction collections include expanded youth collection, popular cookbooks, gardening, mysteries, romance, travel, technology. eBooks, eMagazines and eAudiobooks are also available.

Gladesville Library is located at 6 Pittwater Road, Gladesville. Hours of operation are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday 10.00am-8.00pm, Wednesday and Friday 10.00am-5.00pm and Saturday 9.30am-12 noon.

JRPP Macquarie Centre Decision Hailed As 'Win For The Community'

The City of Ryde Council has welcomed the Joint Regional Planning Panel's (JRPP) decision to approve a development application concept plan that includes provision for 5,000 square metres of dedicated community space, as part of AMP Capital's \$1billion vision for the Macquarie Centre.

Describing the JRPP decision as 'a win for the community', Mayor Pickering said: "Council has been in negotiations with AMP Capital for many months over this project. We wanted to ensure the benefit to the community was substantial and that Council had a presence within the structure. We believe this is a great outcome."

The application approved by the Panel sets out the building envelopes and maximum heights for four buildings on an expanded podium building fronting Herring Road. It includes a new Station Plaza between Macquarie Park station and the shopping centre and four new residential and commercial towers. A covered connection to the train station from inside the shopping centre and a pedestrian tunnel are also part of the project.

The development will be undertaken in stages over several years and future applications will be developed and exhibited to the community. The final construction program is still to be determined.

AMP Capital's Real Estate Head of Asset Creation, Jeff Peers, said: "We are pleased the Stage 1 Concept Plan for Macquarie Centre has been approved. While this is the first step in a long term plan for the precinct, our vision is to transform Macquarie Centre into a world-class centre of discovery and innovation where people can shop, live and work."

The approved development application is accompanied by a Voluntary Planning Agreement between AMP Capital and Council that will see the provision of a community space containing a new library and creative hub facility dedicated for community use on the basis of a long-term arrangement.

Details of the Voluntary Planning Application will go on public exhibition in early 2017.

Name of Future Ryde Civic Hub Site Announced

City of Ryde Mayor Clr Bill Pickering tonight announced the outcome of the naming campaign for the Ryde Civic Hub Precinct (1 Devlin Street, Ryde) as the 'RYDE CENTRAL' site.

"The site is located in the heart of Ryde where civic life began and the name 'RYDE CENTRAL' reflects an enduring association as the symbol of civic, commercial and cultural life of our vibrant City.

"It is fitting that the name recognises the location's historic importance to the area and reflects the community's attachment to the geographic significance of the site.

"The name also represents an important milestone in the ongoing vision for the future development of the City of Ryde and it enables us to look with confidence to the future of this iconic site," the Mayor said.

'RYDE CENTRAL' is the result of a public naming campaign that attracted almost 300 members of the community to choose their preferred name for the Ryde Civic Hub site. It follows an eight-month world-wide architectural competition which was won by the Beijing Institute of Architectural Design entry.

The *Design our Ryde* architectural competition drew entries from 175 entries from 47 countries, including 42 from Australia.

An expert jury and members of the community selected the final four architectural concepts.

Jury Members were: Chair, Peter Poulet, NSW Government Architect; Shaun Carter, President NSW Chapter, Australian Institute of Architects; Maria Atkinson AM, Greater Sydney District Commissioner and Sustainability Strategist.
