Long Term Planning to Improve Traffic and Road Safety around School

Council is undertaking a comprehensive review program to identify changes to traffic, parking and pedestrian activities around all schools in the Ryde local government area.

City of Ryde Mayor, Clr Jerome Laxale, said: "With kids at school, I understand how much of a priority road safety needs to be around schools. After hearing feedback directly from parents, it is clear that a more holistic review is needed for local school communities when it comes to traffic flow, parking and pedestrian access to identify issues before they happen.

"This proactive approach gives us an opportunity to plan and budget for solutions that will deliver better outcomes for each individual school and its local community."

"Importantly, local school parents and residents will be invited to take part in the investigation of each school area. Feedback from locals is crucial to finding the best solutions."

This holistic planning also takes into consideration projected school populations and Council initiated road and pedestrian safety infrastructure projects that will deliver practical solutions to an increasingly complex set of traffic issues.

Reviews of the first four of 28 local schools identified in the prioritised schedule of investigations have begun.

Residents will be invited to take part in information sessions at schools to share their views.

Comprehensive Eastwood Traffic and Parking Study

City of Ryde Council is taking action to make the Eastwood area more accessible for all with the adoption of a Mayoral Minute that calls for a comprehensive Traffic, Parking, Cycling and Pedestrian Study of Eastwood and its surrounds.

The Mayoral Minutes responds to community concerns about traffic in and around Eastwood town centre and multiple quick-fix offers by the State Government to build an Eastwood commuter carpark without the evidence to back them up.

The comprehensive study will look at issues associated with traffic flow (vehicular, pedestrian and cycling), future land use, as well as on-street and off-street parking needs.

City of Ryde Mayor, Clr Jerome Laxale, said: "Eastwood needs a long term solution to traffic and parking in Eastwood with a comprehensive plan that looks at all the contributing factors.

"Eastwood is a rapidly changing centre that needs a holistic approach."

"There have been multiple attempts by Victor Dominello MP to apply a band-aid fix. They have all failed and Council will not be making the same mistake.

"The residents of Eastwood and the City of Ryde deserve much better."

The study is likely to take 4 to 6 months to complete.

Search for Names Missing on Restored WWI Honour Roll

A pair of carefully restored World War One (1914 - 1918) honour boards, dedicated to Eastwood and North Ryde war heroes, have been fully restored and rehomed in time for the 2017 Remembrance Day commemoration.

The restoration of the two maple and gold leaf memorials was commissioned by the Council as part of the City of Ryde's Centenary of ANZAC four-year program and the work was undertaken by three local craftsmen. The refurbishment involved the boards being dismantled, repaired and reassembled. The traditional gold lettering was reapplied and then the boards were French polished.

City of Ryde Mayor and Chair of the Centenary of ANZAC Committee said: "When the honour boards were recovered from storage they were in a poor state and it was immediately noted that one panel from the larger Eastwood board was missing.

"The lengthy restoration began and despite exhaustive research by Ryde's Local Studies Librarian, Angela Phippen and members of the Ryde District Historical Society, the names could not be found.

"Now, we are hoping that members of the community can help fill in the missing link and we are appealing to local families who may have old photographs of the Eastwood honour board showing the missing detail to contact us."

The Eastwood Role of Honor (sic) records the name of 177 soldiers and 1 nurse. It contains a large central panel, with two smaller panels either side (left one missing) and weighs around 20kgs.

The North Ryde School of Arts Role of Honour, measures 4ft x 2ft, with gilt lettering on wood. It contains the names of 47 WWI soldiers from the local area. Of the 47 soldiers, 18 never returned – 4 were killed at Gallipoli and 14 were fatally wounded or killed on the Western Front.

The beautifully restored honour boards now hang in the public area of the City of Ryde Council Chambers, Level 1a, 1 Pope Street (above Ryde Library).
