



#### HOW WE CHOOSE STREET TREE SPECIES

The tree species selected for this year's street tree planting program are all local native species.

Prior to planting trees on Council land, many things are taken into consideration to ensure the right tree is planted at the right location. These include:

- Inspection of the planting site for services and availability of planting space
- A 'dial before you dig' is undertaken to reduce the instances of conflicts between services and trees.

Council has highly qualified staff that have studied and worked in the horticultural industry for many years. We source tree stocks from reputable suppliers who grow according to acceptable nursery standards and the Australian Standard AS2303:2015 'Tree Stock for Landscape Use'.

We do not encourage residents to plant trees in Council road reserves due to tree quality and consistency of plantings.

### **BENEFITS OF STREET TREES**

Trees play an important role in the 'greening' of our City and are an invaluable asset for our community.

More trees will:

- Provide relief from summer's heat and reduce glare from the pavement
- Improve air quality
- Enhance biodiversity
- Counter climate change and heat islands
- Make your surroundings pleasant
- Reduce runoff.

Increasing Greater Sydney's tree canopy to 40 percent is one of the Premier's priorities, with a target to plant five million trees by 2030.

# **CARING FOR STREET TREES**

Council is responsible for the ongoing maintenance of street trees, however, residents can lend a helping hand by:

- Watering the newly planted street tree regularly
- Maintaining the mulch circle around the base of the tree
- Protecting the tree from mower and whipper snipper damage
- Monitor and contact Council regarding any maintenance concerns.
