You can, and it won't cost you a cent, thanks to the new eBooks and eAudiobooks online catalogue from City of Ryde Library Services www.ryde.nsw.gov.au/library.

There are thousands of popular fiction and non-fiction titles listed to download to your Windows PC, Mac, compatible tablet, eBook reader or smart phone.

City of Ryde Mayor, Clr Artin Etmekdjian, said: "The new service is all about making it easier for members of the community to conveniently access free information and entertainment anywhere, anytime.

"It is also a very cost effective way for our libraries to cater to the demands of our diverse community.

"From now on you won't have to put your name on a list to be the first to read the latest novels, or pay fees to download technical journals, newspapers or magazines."

The new service, to be launched on Monday 16 July, is available to Library Members who live, work or study in the City of Ryde or Hunters Hill.

All you need is a current Library Membership card and PIN number then follow the easy online prompts. Users can borrow up to five eBooks or eAudiobooks at a time for a period of 21 days. Titles will automatically expire at the end of that time and there are no late fees, either. Library Membership is free and you can also join online.

Free WiFi is also now available at all five local library branches at Ryde, North Ryde, West Ryde, Eastwood and Gladesville, so bring your own equipment to the library and log on for free.
