If you are a seasoned gardener, beginner, or part of a group, there's a category to suit you, including a new 'community garden' section.

- Best Large Garden: private residential garden whole garden or section
- Best Small Garden: private residential garden whole garden or section
- **Best Courtyard or Balcony:** private residential garden using pots, planter boxes, ornaments, walled gardens etc.
- Best Edible Garden: vegetable, fruit, permaculture
- **Best Children's Garden:** private residential gardens inspired and created by a child, group of children or a family with young children
- **Best School Garden:** gardens within local primary or high schools where students and teachers or the community have worked together
- Best Pre-School Garden: gardens within local pre-schools where students and teachers or the community have worked together
- \*New\* Best Community Garden: garden projects where the local community, groups or community organisations have worked together
- **Best Commercial Garden:** gardens within local businesses and commercial organisations, eg hotels, retirement villages, commercial premises, small businesses, universities etc
- Best Bushcare Site: for an outstanding contribution made by volunteers to a Bushcare site.
