

Appendix G – Personalised Journey Plan

Example

How much would it cost?

The fare from PLACE to PLACE at that time of day is £0.80 for a single. A weekly pass costs £7.00.
and a monthly pass costs £26.90.

So where do I buy my ticket?

A normal single fare can be bought on the bus from the driver and it helps if you have some change to pay for this. Weekly and monthly tickets can be bought from most newsagents and underground stations. You will also need a photocard (which you can get from these places too) before you can use one of these.

Try it once for free!

Use the voucher inside this journey planner to try the bus for free. It entitles you to a days free travel on the A10 bus, on whichever day you choose before the end of December. Simply fill in the date on the voucher and present it to the bus driver at the start of your journey.

When you catch it

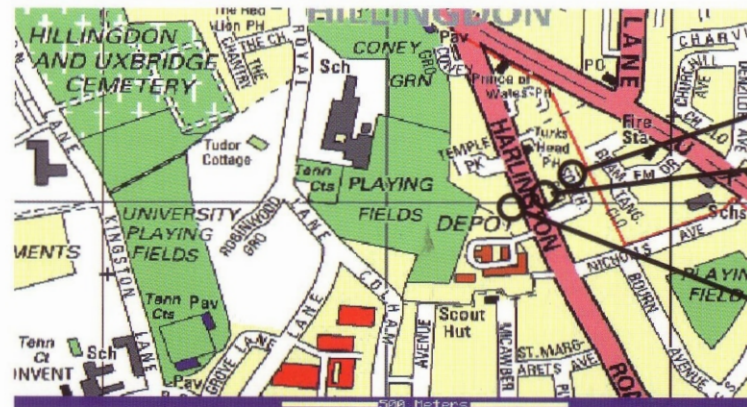
To get to Stockley Park to start work at ABCD as you did on

Monday, you would need to catch the bus at about 09.52am. The return bus you would catch leaves Stockley Park at 06.00pm.

Reaching your destination

To alert the driver when you want to get off you may need to press one of the buttons on the vertical hand rails. Just push the button before your stop and the driver will know someone wants to get off. If you're not sure, ask another passenger—and even though speaking to the driver is not encouraged, most don't mind you checking if the next stop is yours.

The bus stop where you could get on and off near home is:

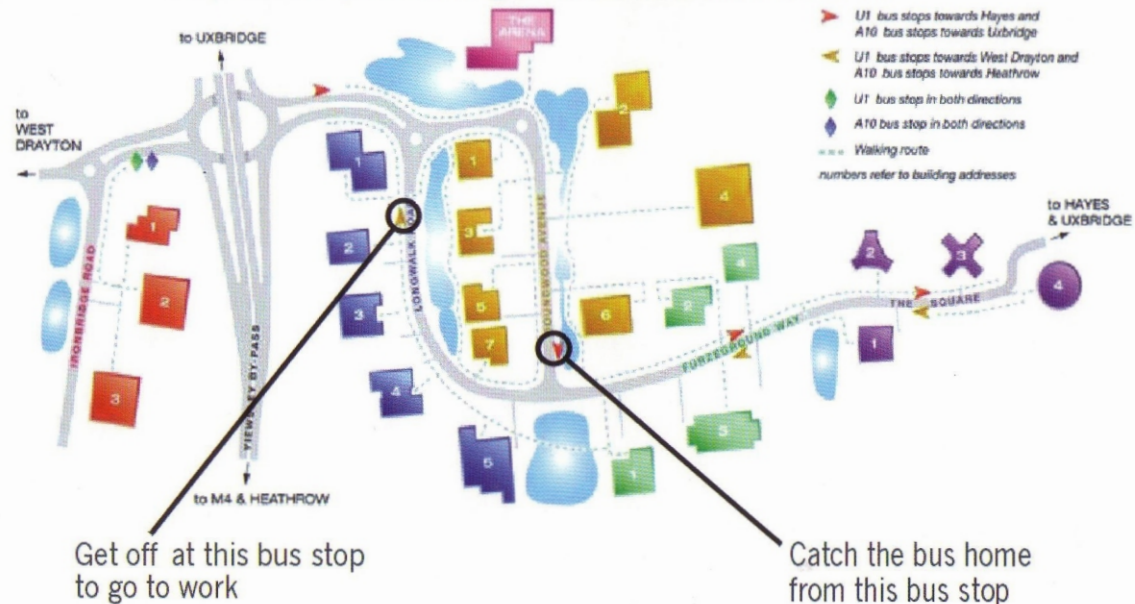


Your Home
