In a great example of collaboration between councils, staff from the City of Ryde have travelled to Central Darling Shire Council local government area to assess a development application for an Aboriginal Cultural Centre in Wilcannia, located in Far West NSW.

The new centre will be an important development for Central Darling Shire Council due its cultural significance as well as its potential to attract tourists to the region.

While the efforts of the City of Ryde staff will be of tremendous benefit to Central Darling Shire, it will also be of great value for our Council as it will provide the staff involved with an important learning opportunity while also expanding their skillset.

The City of Ryde will continue to explore opportunities to collaborate with Central Darling Shire Council as well as other councils as it will deliver a number of positives for our organisation and the community.

SAVINGS FOR RATEPAYERS

With the increased cost of living placing more pressure on households in the City of Ryde, Council has unanimously endorsed a proposal to reduce the 2022/23 standard Domestic Waste Management Charge.

If this reduction comes into effect it will save residents an average of approximately \$8 per household.

The proposal is outlined in the

Draft 2022-2026 Four Year Delivery Program, One Year Operational Plan 2022/23 & Draft 2022/23 Fees and Charges, which are now on public exhibition until 29 May 2022.

These documents also outline the projects and initiatives Council has committed to deliver for the community over the next four years.
