MAYOR'S **COMMUNITY MESSAGE**

KEY WORKER HOUSING

I'm pleased to report that at the 10 June 2025 Extraordinary Meeting Council endorsed City of Ryde's Draft Key Workers Affordable Housing Policy, which is an ambitious plan to help our most vital workers find homes within the community they so selflessly serve.

Over the next 10 years we're aiming to provide 1,000 new affordable rental dwellings for nurses, teachers and Triple Zero workers – police, firefighters and paramedics – through various existing planning mechanisms.

The new target represents a significant increase in the creation of affordable housing dwellings within the City of Ryde. It is based on the housing targets to be delivered in Ryde over the same period and the affordable housing scheme included as part of the Macquarie Park **Transport Orientated Development** Accelerated Precinct rezoning.

We're also planning an element of affordable housing in the proposed development of a new civic centre at 150 – 156 Blaxland Road.

We cannot do without these key workers – and I'm proud to be able to help make their lives a little easier.

celebrate cultural diversity, and build meaningful local connections. For full details, go to:






