FIFA Live Site

The World Cup live site at ELS Hall Park will broadcast the entire match on a big screen and also have a stack of family friendly activities taking place throughout the evening.

There will also be food trucks to keep everyone well fed and heaters to ensure comfortable conditions for all.

It will be a terrific atmosphere so I can hope you can all get down to ELS Hall Park and cheer on Australia as they try to make history. Activities start at 6pm, with the match kickingoff at 8pm.

Hundreds of trees and more traffic chaos expected

Despite the very public claims by the NSW Government that it is putting a freeze on development in Ryde, last week we were hit with plans for another monster development, this time at Ivanhoe Estate.

This new priority precinct will replace 259 dwellings with 3500 new units – an increase of 1250%.

What makes this massive development worse is the fact that the current proposal will result in the loss of 858 trees (including the endangered Sydney Turpentine Ironbark Forest) more traffic congestion on local roads, insufficient open spaces for recreation and public areas devoid of sunlight due to the sheer size of the buildings.

I stood side by side with the residents of Ivanhoe Estate and urged the NSW Government to reconsider its plans, however, this was ignored by the government including the Member for Ryde, the Hon. Victor Dominello.

How can Mr Dominello say he is against over-development, but yet be a vocal supporter of this proposed development?

Unlike Mr Dominello, the City of Ryde has demanded proper action against overdevelopment and called on the NSW Government to abolish priority precincts and restore balance to the planning system.

If Mr Dominello was fair dinkum he would publicly support Council's position.

The supply of personal information is voluntary. However if you choose to make an anonymous submission it may be given less weight (or no weight) in the overall consideration of the application. The above applications and accompanying information may also be inspected electronically at the Ryde Customer Service Centre, 1 Pope Street, Ryde (within Top Ryde City shopping centre) between 8.30am and 5.00pm Monday to Friday during the period in which submissions may be made.
