



Sportsgrounds open for training

With the announcement by the NSW Government that kids' sport and community sport competitions can resume from 1 July, I would like to remind all sporting associations and clubs that sportsgrounds in the City of Ryde can currently be used for training purposes.

This means that all existing winter season sporting user groups have their allocations valid for all dates.

Sporting groups who wish to resume training but do not have any allocations, will need to make a booking with Council a minimum of 24 hours prior to the first training session being requested.

To ensure the health and safety of everyone, all training will need to comply with the latest government advice and public health orders.

Council has also increased the frequency of cleaning public toilets during this period. Change rooms will remain closed during the initial return to training as recommended in sporting code guidelines.
