Celebrating our Sesquicentenary

Last week on Wednesday 10 February we celebrated the Sesquicentenary (150 years) of the City of Ryde with a special morning tea at Ryde Park. This day marked the 150th anniversary of the first Council election that followed our Municipality's proclamation on 12 November 1870.

Edna Wilde OAM, our first female Mayor and longest serving Councillor, joined me in unveiling a plaque that commemorates the 150th anniversary of the Ryde Local Government Area.

We acknowledged our 150-year history through a photo display of Ryde's 'People, Places and Progress' and a traditional Aboriginal dancing ceremony performed by Garrigal Culture.

Former Mayors, past Councillors and General Managers, current serving Councillors and Council staff, prominent members of the community and the Ryde District Historical society joined us for this celebratory event.

While we celebrate 150 years as a Council, it is important that we acknowledge the contribution of the Wallumedegal people, remember their tragic story, and always recognise that the land we stand on today always was and always will be Aboriginal land.
