# **CONFLICTS OF INTEREST**

A conflict of interest arises if it is likely that a private interest could conflict, or be seen to conflict, with the performance of your public or professional duties.

It is essential that members of the public, when dealing with our Council, can be confident that when making decisions staff and Councillors are free of any conflicts of interest.

Conflicts of interest can be of two types:

# 1. Pecuniary Interest

Is an interest that you have in a matter because of a reasonable likelihood or expectation of an appreciable financial gain or loss to you, or to another person with whom you are associated. This would include your spouse, de facto partner or a relative. (Section 442(1) Local Government Act).

# 2. Non-Pecuniary Interest

Is a private or personal interest, which you have, that does not pertain or relate to money. For example, a friendship, family, membership of a club, sporting or community group, society or trade union.

A conflict of interest would arise where:

- you have a personal interest that would lead you to be influenced in the way you carry out your Council work or public duties.
- you have a personal interest that could lead a fair person to think you could be influenced in the way that you carry out your Council work or public duties.
- you have knowledge that a family member, relative, friend, associate or anybody else close to you has an interest that could lead to you being influenced, or a fair person to think that you could be influenced, in a way that you carry out your Council work or public duties.

What should you do if you have a conflict of interest?

If any conflict exists between your interests and those of the Council it must always be resolved to the satisfaction of Council.

If, as a staff member, you believe that you are faced with, or could be seen to be faced with, a conflict or pecuniary interest you must advise your Group Manager or the General Manager in writing by completing this form. In the case of the General Manager, advice must be given to the Council or if this is not practical then advice must be given to the Mayor and subsequently to Council.

Depending on the nature of interest disclosed, arrangements can be made to limit your involvement in the matter or remove you from the source of the conflict (ie. By appointing an alternate staff member to manage the particular matter).

If you have any doubt as to whether you have a conflict of interest in a particular matter, you should seek assistance from your Manager/Group Manager/General Manager or obtain legal advice and act accordingly.

- (b) the business proposed to be brought forward is ruled by the Chairperson to be of great urgency. Such a motion can be moved without notice.
- (4) Despite clause 250 (3.18.1) only the mover of a motion referred to in subclause (3) can speak to the motion before it is put.

# **Discussion**

# Overview of the City of Ryde

The following detail provides a brief overview of the key features, statistics and areas managed by Council on behalf of its community:-

- The City of Ryde covers an area of approximately 40 square kilometres
- Council has a total of approximately 41,000 ratable properties and a population of approximately 105,000
- 42% of our community are born overseas
- 310km of roads
- 402km of footpaths
- 250km of drainage
- 128 community buildings
- 207 parks & sportsground
- 94 playgrounds
- In excess of 200 hectares of natural areas that includes over 60 hectares of playing fields

# Overview of Council's Achievements – 2011/2012

A video will be shown at the meeting to highlight Council's key achievements for 2012. The following list is provided that gives a more detailed listing of Council's key achievements:-

- Opened the West Ryde Community Centre
- Completed a range of works relating to Council's road, drainage, footpath infrastructure
- Introduced initiatives to remove red tape in the DA approval process and assessed over 640 development applications
- Welcomed over 840,000 visitors to our libraries who borrow over 1 million items
- Substantial growth in our library activities and events that saw a 107% increase in attendance in 2011/12
- Council achieved 3012 tonnes of corporate greenhouse gas savings in 2011/12
- Completed 12,500 tree plantings across our City of Ryde
- 42% reduction in water use by businesses sustainable businesses in Ryde
- Council's Strategic Waste Action Plan played a key role in reducing waste to landfill and meeting State Government's recycling targets
- Council has serviced 169 waste and recycling bin stations in shopping centres and 282 in local parks
- Introduced the School Banner program that educated parents in both Pedestrian Safety and Ranger Awareness
- Upgraded Agincourt Road Shopping strip
- Upgraded public toilets in Cox's Road



- Top Ryder Bus Service had 57,434 passengers throughout the year
- Conducted senior celebrations, improved disability awareness and became a White Ribbon Partner
- Supported many community groups through Council's Community Grants program
- Completed Council's Open Space Plan that will play a key role in developing our City's future
- Upgraded the Ryde Aquatic Leisure Centre's competition and leisure pools
- Established partnerships with our local businesses and the Ryde Business Forum
- Various initiatives in supporting our business community
- Reduced Council's carbon footprint with many initiatives including Council's fleet, buildings, energy and water usage
- Worked extensively with our community to bring back the bush in the River to River Wildlife and Corridors project
- Delivered free community WiFi to our four branch libraries
- Advanced the completion of our Asset Management Plans
- Commenced the construction of Livvi's Place, Yamble Reserve
- Continued to develop and support Ryde Youth Theatre and Ryde Youth Council
- Continued to focus on our customers, with improved services at the Ryde Planning and Business Centre and the introduction of our Customer Feedback system
- Council responded to approximately 63,000 customer requests from residents
- Council received 27,923 customer service enquiries and 23,918 DA enquiries
- City of Ryde was successful in winning various awards across all areas of Council
- Various initiatives taken to improve council's corporate governance framework including the areas of Risk, Audit and Procurement
- As part of the Charity Creek Cascades, Shepherd Street, Ryde, a Park upgrade which included a new shared user path, landscaping, shade sail, new playground and park furniture.
- Shrimptons Creek, Santa Rosa Park, Ryde Creek Rehabilitation, with the
  project focused on improving water quality in Shrimptons Creek which is affected
  by stormwater pollution and weed infestation. Works involved construction of a
  trash rack, weed and sediment removal, grading of creek banks, rock armouring
  and planting. In addition a network of pedestrian paths as built along the creek
  line
- Ryde Community Sports Centre at ELS Hall Park, North Ryde. This project comprises a 2293m2 multi purpose sports and community facility located at ELS Hall Park, North Ryde. It was built by the City of Ryde with joint funding from the federal government and City of Ryde. The facility is managed by the YMCA.

# Snapshot of Key Highlights for the 2012/2013 Year – Central Ward

The following are a selection of key projects from Council's Operational Plan for 2012/3 that are within Council's Central Ward.



# Livvi's Place - Yamble Reserve

Whilst on the boundary roads of East and Central Wards, this project has been well received by our community and was completed and officially opened on 3 February 2013. Livvi's Place is the first all inclusive playground for children of all abilities in Northern Sydney and their carers.

# Sportsfield Upgrades

- Meadowbank Netball Courts This project involved the construction of two (2)
  new netball courts in order for the Eastwood Ryde Netball Association to be
  eligible to host the State Championships for Division 2 at Meadowbank Park. The
  project was jointly funded by ERNA (via grant monies) and the City of Ryde. The
  courts were opened in March 2013.
- ELS Hall Park Drainage and irrigation works in fields 2 and 3 completed

# Open Space Upgrade

- Meadowbank Park playground replacement, concrete paths and park furniture
- Queens Jubilee Trees Commemorative planting of 60 trees along the Ryde Riverside reserve from Meadowbank Park to Putney Park in order to commemorate the 60 year jubilee celebrations of the reign of Queen Elizabeth II
- Charity Creek Cascades park upgrade, Bowden Street, Ryde Shared user path, kerb ramps and park furniture

# <u>Cycleways</u>

Blaxland Road stage 1, Ryde - A new cycleway (shared user path) was constructed along Blaxland Road, Lane Cove Road and Ryde TAFE. This is stage 1 of a Roads and Maritime funded project which provides a missing link to the City of Ryde cycleway network. This stage of project was completed in May 2013 and included a shared user path on the south side of the road and utility pit adjustments

# Waste

Council has been successful in continuing to increase construction recycling and reducing construction and demolition waste from being taken to landfill. In addition to the environmental benefits, this has resulted in reduced costs of Council's construction works together with offering this service to other neighbouring Councils.

As at the 31 December 2012, a total of 19,500 tonnes of Council construction and demolition waste had been reused.

# Ryde City Library

Key highlights and statistics relating to Ryde Library which has now been opened for two (2) full years.

Visits. Visitor numbers have grown from

- 120,028 (last year of old library)
- 273,902 (first year of new library) an increase of 128%
- 305,969 (2nd year of new library) a further increase of 11.7%
- Every month we continue to grow on the same month in the previous year (24 straight months of growth)

# Events.

- Old library had limited capacity. It offered
  - 1 storytime per week
  - o school holiday activities
  - o about 6 talks or events for adults each year
- New library has great capacity. It offers
  - 2 storytimes per week
  - 2 baby rhymetimes per week
  - o school holiday activities
  - o weekly school kids club
  - regular program for adults including lifelong learning talks, author talks, monthly musical morning teas and muliticultural program
  - IT training



 Special events have included Sydney Writers Festival, high profile author talks, evening program capability, partnered events such as the Eisteddfod conference launch, Ryde Business Forum, launch of council initiatives such as My Place and the new web site

# Review of Ryde 2021 Community Strategic Plan

Council undertook a comprehensive process in developing and adopting the Ryde 2021 Community Strategic Plan. Council commenced this process in late 2008, following Council's resolution on 5 December 2008 to undertake the development of the Plan.

At Council's meeting 28 June 2011, Council adopted the Ryde 2021 Community Strategic Plan following extensive consultation with our community.

Following this Council's election in September 2012, Council at its meeting of 26 March 2013 resolved to undertake a review of the 2021 Community Strategic Plan in a three phase approach:-

# Phase 1

The draft 2025 Community Strategic Plan will be placed on public exhibition in conjunction with the public exhibition of the 2013-2017 Draft Delivery Plan. This plan will be Council's current plan with a few minor changes. Following exhibition a report will be provided back to Council prior to 30 June 2013, recommending to formally adopt the Ryde 2025 Community Strategic Plan.

## Phase 2

This phase of the project will focus on the engagement plan where Council will be undertaking a comprehensive and broad engagement with the community and key stakeholders. The engagement plan will have a number of stages including the pre engagement, engagement, post engagement and analysis of data collected in preparing the report back to Council.

## Phase 3

This phase will complete the analysis of the data and revise the Draft Ryde 2025 Community Strategic Plan for Council's consideration before placing the Plan back on public exhibition.

The timeframe proposed to undertake and complete phases two and three is between July 2013 to February 2014.



# **Financial Implications**

Council considered its 2013-2017 Draft Delivery Plan and 2013/2014 Operational Plan at its meeting on 14 May 2013. Council's draft plans are on exhibition from 22 May 2013 to 18 June 2013 and will be reported back to Council for adoption on 25 June 2013.

Council in finalising its 2013-2017 Draft Delivery Plan and its 2013/2014 Operational Plan, is also planning to consider how it will address its long term financial position, especially in respect of its estimated \$120 million backlog of infrastructure works. This will be done in conjunction with Council reviewing its Resourcing Strategy and Community Strategic Plan.

Currently, Council is under funding its infrastructure renewal program by an estimated \$8 - \$10 million, which is continuing to grow each year in line with the growth of Council's infrastructure assets. City of Ryde's current value of infrastructure assets is \$1.3 billion.

Council is projecting a Working Capital surplus for the 2013/14 year of \$3 million.
