1.1 ANZAC PARK AERIAL  
ANZAC PARK MASTERPLAN, WEST RYDE NSW

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Anzac Park is located in West Ryde to the east of West Ryde Train Station and town centre. Anzac Park (the Park) is approximately 150m from West Ryde Station and 50m from the town centre making it within close proximity to infrastructure and services. Anzac Park is bounded on all four sides by streets including Ryedale Lane to the west, Wattle Street to the north, Anzac Avenue to the east and Herbert Street to the south.

Anzac Park measures approximately 1.22 hectares with topography falling gently from the west to east as the lowest point. The Park is predominantly characterised by the diagonal pathway axis that splits the Park into four quadrants. The Park is also characterised by the strong avenues of deciduous trees along the main axis pathways, around the north perimeter as well as the dense tree clusters to the north east corner.

The Park features the children's playground constructed in 2020 to the north east, ANZAC commemorative plaques and flag poles in the centre and open recreation picnic space to the west, south and east. A small amenities building was constructed in 1986/1987 and is located to the north east underneath the dense tree canopies. The Park is known for hosting a number of community events such as the ANZAC Day Ceremony and West Ryde Garden Bar.

In the interest of the community and growing West Ryde population, City of Ryde Council has developed a Masterplan for Anzac Park that will incorporate passive and active recreation.

The Masterplan aims to provide the framework for how the Park will be upgraded over the next 20 years. This strategic plan aims to meet the current and future recreational needs of the community and user groups, while ensuring sustainable and efficient use and ecological outcomes. This Masterplan incorporates the site's surrounding context, while maximising the Park's potential for the broader community.

The goals of this Masterplan are to:

- Improve connectivity to the surrounding West Ryde context and town centre
- Improve existing active and passive recreation uses
- Introduce new and exciting active and passive recreation uses including multi-purpose facilities
- Make Anzac Park a hub for community events and recreation within West Ryde
- Identify improvement projects so the Park best services the future needs of the community
- Demonstrate effective future provision, conservation, planning and development of facilities
- Guide Council over the next 20 years on how the park will be upgraded
- Identify stages for implementation which may be suitable for future external grant funding opportunities

### Relating Strategic Council Documents

There are a number of strategic documents that provide context in regard to Anzac Park. These documents include:

#### Draft West Ryde Town Centre Masterplan (2022)

Council is planning for the future of the West Ryde Town Centre by preparing the West Ryde Town Centre Masterplan (draft) to help encourage the rejuvenation of the area into a distinctive, vibrant, and attractive local centre.

The draft West Ryde Town Centre Masterplan includes the following key points which are applicable to Anzac Park:

- One of the objectives of the West Ryde Town Centre Masterplan is to: improve access to and functionality of existing open spaces to maximise their benefit to the local community, including Anzac Park, Darvall Park and the Sydney Water site.
- New developments should be responsive to the desired village character of Ryedale Road to the west and the existing open space characteristics of Anzac Park.
- Anzac Park is considered to be an important existing open space that is to be protected from overshadowing.
- Future active transport and public transport links in immediate vicinity of Anzac Park.

#### Draft Green Links Masterplan (2021)

Anzac Park sits within the Meadowbank/ West Ryde Precinct as part of the *Draft Green Links Masterplan*. This precinct provides connection between the Parramatta River and Blaxland Road for pedestrians and cyclists. Within the Meadowbank/ West Ryde Precinct the Green Link Shared User Path is proposed along Wattle Street adjacent Anzac Park, running between Hermitage and Ryedale Roads. This Shared User Path will ultimately provide Anzac Park with increased connectivity across the wider City of Ryde local government area.

#### Integrated Open Space Plan (2012)

Anzac Park is identified within the *Integrated Open Space Plan* as a Level 3 Open Space within the open space hierarchy between Levels 1 and 4. Level 3 typically represents the 2nd smallest open spaces within City of Ryde, with Level 4 representing the smallest open space areas. Anzac Park as Level 3 attracts a greater level of use, encourage longer stays and contribute to the identity and character of the local area. These spaces also provide convenient access to passive and active recreational opportunities for local residents of all age groups.

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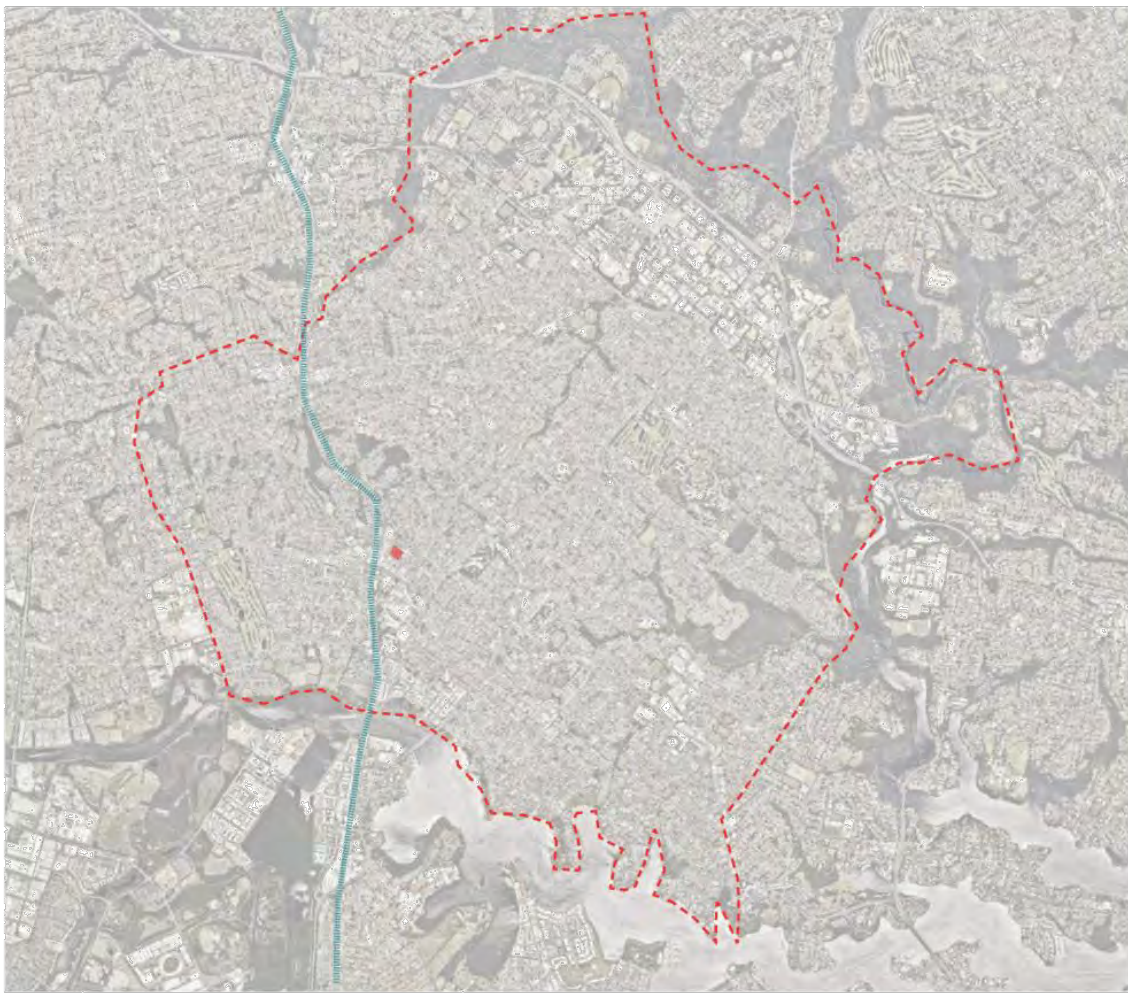

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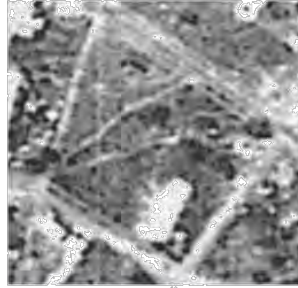

### ANZAC PARK HISTORICAL TIMELINE

1919 - First suggestion that a park was needed in West Ryde by Councillors.<sup>1</sup>

1926 - Alternative uses for the current site were suggested including bitumen concrete plant.<sup>2</sup>

1935 - The Parks and Lighting Committee inspected the land in Wattle Street, Herbert Street and Anzac Avenue in February.<sup>3</sup>

1936 - The Parks & Lighting Committee recommended that the offer to acquire land be approved.<sup>4</sup> Council needed to forward £1077 to acquire all land with frontage to Herbert, Wattle and Anzac Streets.<sup>5</sup>

1937 – Wattle Street Park becomes Anzac Park. At the meeting of the Parks Committee on 13 March 1937 there were reports presented on a number of parks including the 'Wattle Street Park', later decided 'Anzac Park'.<sup>6</sup> The committee recommended the following works; fencing, planting of Oleander and Poplar trees, levelling and grassing and pavilion shelter.<sup>10</sup>

1938-1943 - Works were undertaken including tree planting and the prominent diagonal pathways. During World War II by 1943 zig-zag slit trenches were constructed along Herbert St due to the fear of air raid attacks during.<sup>11</sup> A fake Victoria Road alignment was also put through the Park to confuse enemy aerial bombers.

1956-1961 - Turf netball courts were constructed in north west portion of Anzac Park.<sup>11</sup>

1965 - Netball Courts were removed.<sup>11</sup>

1971 - Plans for beautification were prepared including new planting and toilet block adjacent the corner of Herbert and Ryedale Lane (no toilet block was completed).<sup>13</sup>

1978 - New plans were prepared including car barriers, shrub and tree planting, adventure playground and junior playground as well as entry pergola at the Wattle Street and Anzac Avenue entry.<sup>11</sup>

1980 - Additional planting, playground, entry pergola and lighting completed.<sup>11</sup>

1986-1987 - Current toilet block constructed.<sup>11</sup>

2003 - Upgrade works were undertaken including additional pathways, BBQs, formalised garden beds with planting, playground relocation to adjacent Anzac Avenue and new park furniture.<sup>11</sup>

2018 - In respect to Centenary of ANZAC Day (2018), commemorative plaques were installed in the central garden bed.<sup>11</sup>

2019-2020 – Council's Heritage Review in 2019 identified Anzac Park as "Heritage Item". The Heritage Review Planning Proposal went through extensive community consultation in September – November 2019 and reported to Council on 12 December 2019. The Ryde Local Environment Plan (2014) was amended on 27 November 2020 to incorporate the new heritage items/areas, including Anzac Park.

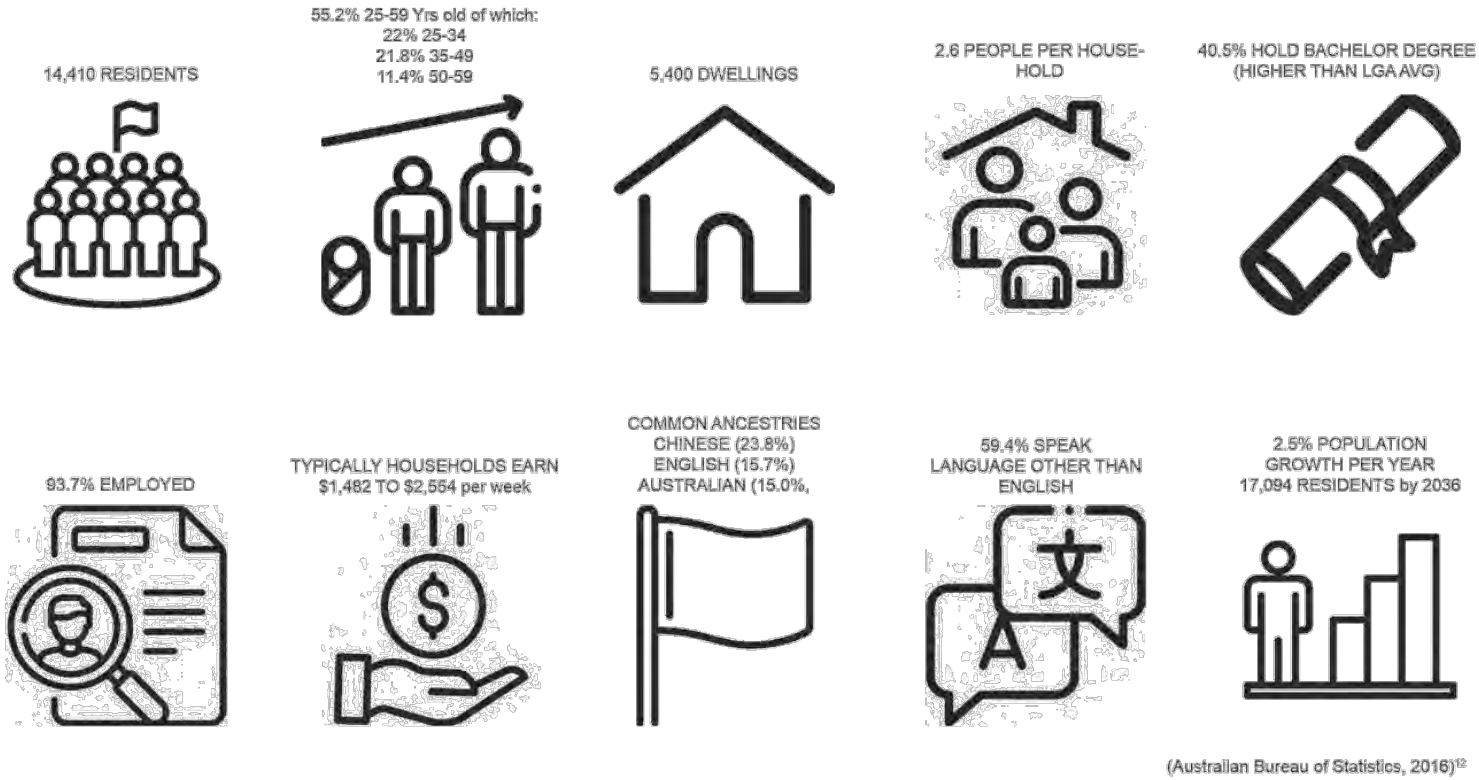

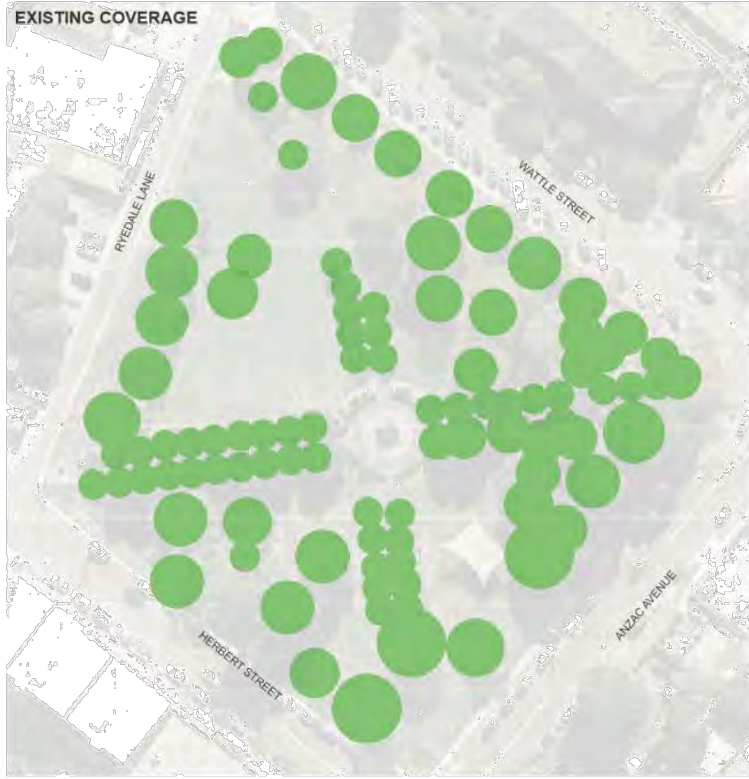

Located in West Ryde, Anzac Park currently includes an Anzac memorial, flagpoles, gardens, a district-level playground, lighting, seating, BBQs, shade structures and an amenities building.

The purpose of this Stage 1 community consultation is for Council to understand the current and likely future recreation and leisure needs of the community in order to develop a draft Masterplan for Anzac Park.

City of Ryde's Community Engagement team conducted the Stage 1 community consultation process to gather feedback from the community to inform the draft Masterplan design for Anzac Park.

Stage 1 community consultation was conducted from 29 June to 25 July 2021 during which the community could provide comment and suggestions via an online interactive map, paper form or registered phone session with Council staff. This was promoted through City of Ryde's Have Your Say website, flyers to surrounding residents, an eNewsletter to stakeholders, other Council eNewsletters to the community, signage in the park and an advertisement in the local newspaper.

In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, Council conducted one-on-one phone sessions in lieu of face-to-face drop-in sessions. Community members could register for a one-on-one phone discussion with a member of the Parks team to provide feedback and ask any questions.

In total 117 comments were received from the community with 108 comments from the online interactive map, 6 email submissions and 3 phone submissions.

Through the Stage 1 community consultation, respondents expressed they liked the park including its current playground and open grassed spaces. Some suggestions for improvement included additional shaded seating facilities, pedestrian safety, additional lighting, exercise equipment, sports court and upgraded amenities building.

The feedback from this Stage 1 community consultation will be used to inform the draft Masterplan for Anzac Park. Once the draft Masterplan has been prepared, the community will be provided with an opportunity to provide feedback on the draft design via a Stage 2 community consultation.

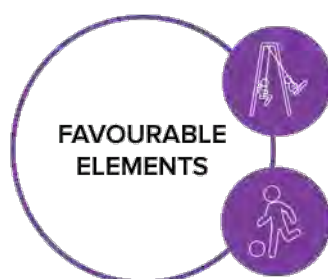

The current **playground** was favourable and highly used, while some respondents also suggested additional equipment.

The availability of **open grassed space** was a favourable element of the park, including its use for family activities and community events. Some respondents also noted they like the **trees and plants** and want these elements to be protected.



Respondents like and/or suggested additional **shaded seating** and **picnic/BBQ areas**. Additional **lighting** was suggested for improved safety and for aesthetics, as well extended **pathways** and an upgraded **amenities building**.

Suggestions for **exercise equipment** and a basketball or multi-purpose **sport court** were also received. Some also suggested the inclusion of a **table tennis** table in the park.



**Pedestrian safety** was highlighted as an area for improvement. Pedestrian crossings and traffic calming equipment were suggested. The creation of a **shared pedestrian zone** in Ryedale Lane and activation of nearby shops was also favoured.

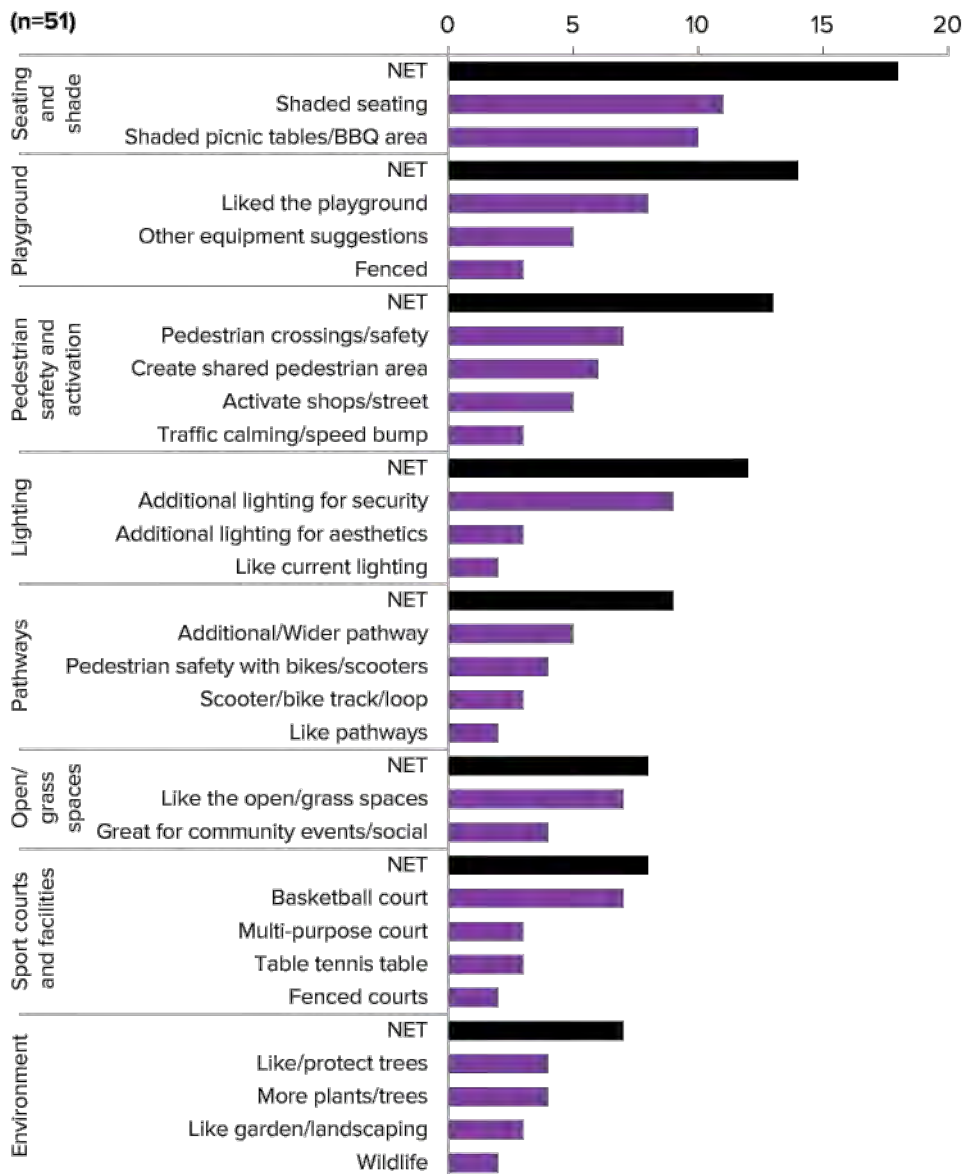

The draft Masterplan includes an improved pathway network; new seating, picnic and BBQ facilities; new fitness and seniors exercise equipment; new table tennis table; new amenities building; more trees and other general park improvements. The plans retain the existing playground and Anzac memorial.

Stage 2 community consultation was conducted from 1 February to 27 February 2022 during which the community could provide comment and suggestions via an online interactive map or community drop-in sessions with Council staff. This was promoted through City of Ryde's Have Your Say website, flyers to surrounding residents, an eNewsletter to stakeholders, other Council eNewsletters to the community, signage in the park, a post on Council's social media page and an advertisement in the local newspaper.

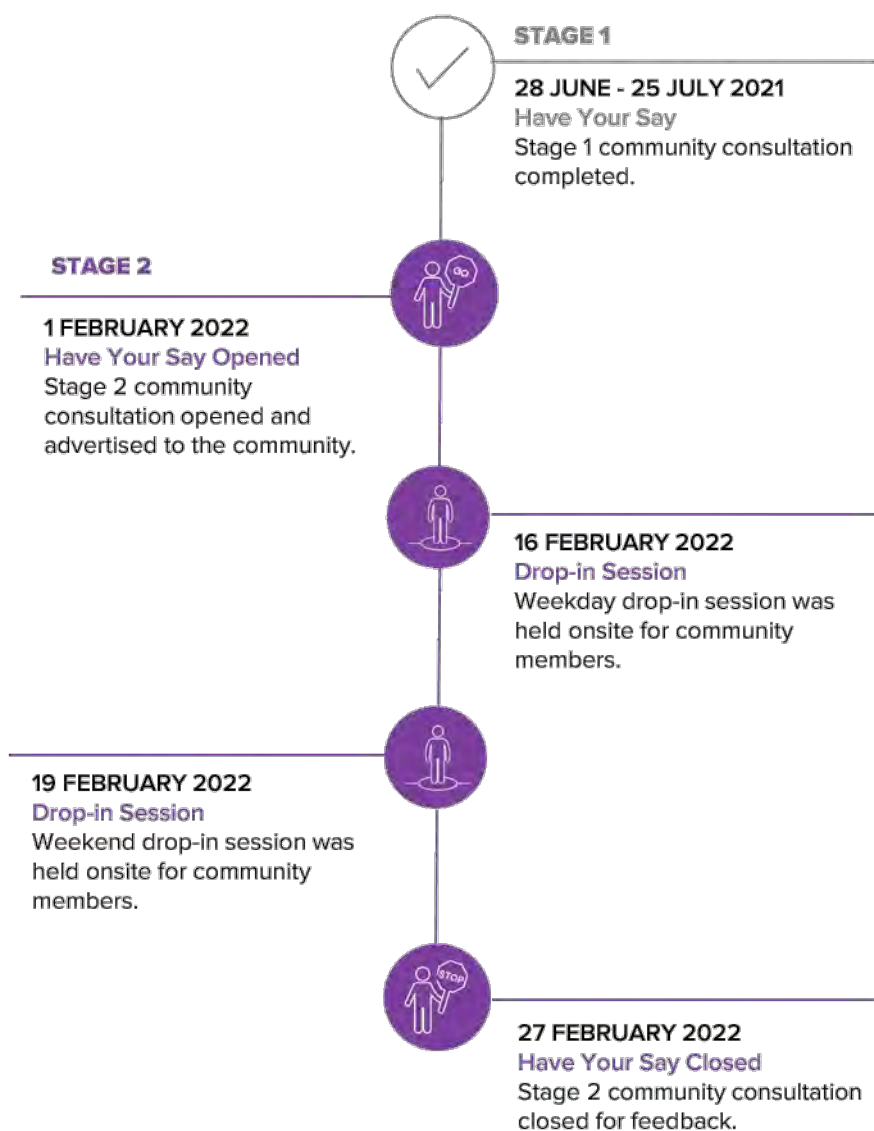
In total 60 community members provided 197 comments with 102 comments from the drop-in sessions, 89 comments from the online interactive map and 6 email submissions.

Through the Stage 2 community consultation respondents expressed the importance of retaining open grass space throughout the park and not overfilling the park with facilities and pathways. 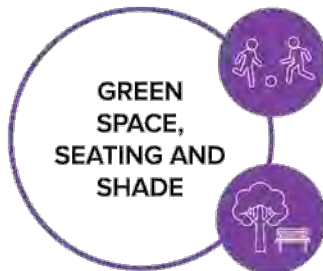

The importance of retaining **open grassed space** was noted by many comments, including not overfilling the park with facilities and pathways. Comments also noted keeping/planting **additional trees**, particularly natives.

The need for additional **seating** was noted, as well as positive comments regarding the terrace seating/ amphitheatre. Picnic tables were also favoured, however with shade. The importance of **shade** in other areas was also noted, including the playground.



The current **playground** received positive comments as well as suggestions for additional equipment and to move other users/facilities away from the playground.

The proposed **exercise equipment** and **table tennis** facilities received positive comments, however some comments suggested alternative locations within the park for exercise equipment. Positive comments were also received regarding the event and food/cafe facilities.



Comments indicated that **additional pathways** were typically not favoured throughout the park. **Parking, pedestrian and traffic safety** considerations were also highlighted, including a raised pedestrian crossing, traffic calming measures and fencing the park/playground.

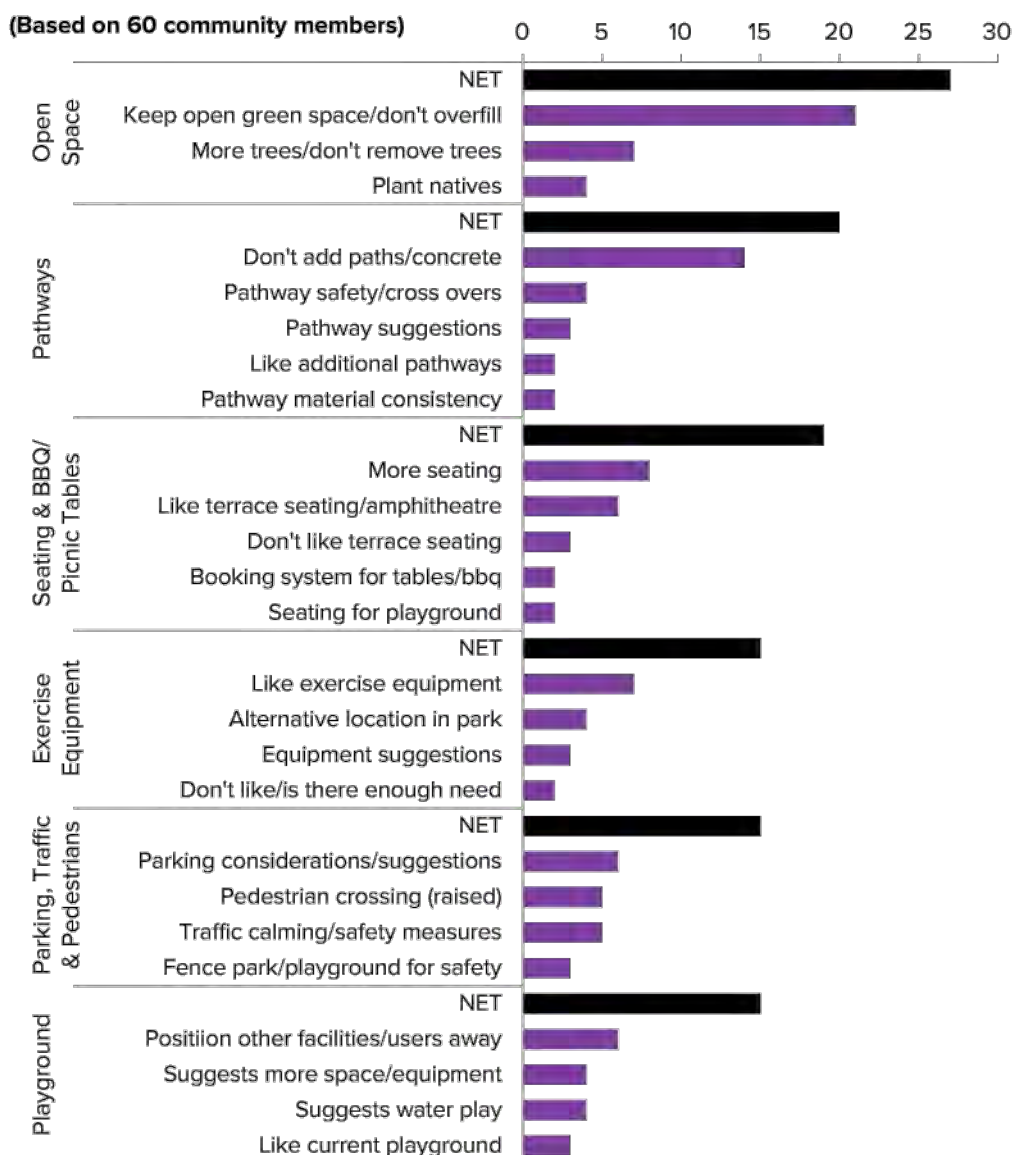
