
2 LET'S LIGHT UP FOOTBALL IS ON AGAIN - Councillor Roy Maggio

Football NSW is excited to once more flick the switch with another year of funding under the extremely successful 'Let's Light Up Football' campaign. Due to the overwhelming number of grant applications in 2018 and the success in lighting up some 17 football pitches, Football NSW is pleased to offer another tranche of vital funding to football clubs for this much needed aspect of facility improvements.

Applications for the Let's Light Up Football campaign will open in April 2019 (date to be confirmed) with the guidelines and the online application made available when the grant officially opens. Affiliated clubs and associations, local councils and schools will again be eligible to apply. The fund will provide up to 20% of a floodlighting project with a maximum of \$20,000 available per project. The project will also need confirmed approval from the relevant local government authority as part of the eligibility criteria. Football NSW encourages clubs, associations and councils to collaborate now and be prepared when the grant opens in April.

MOTION:

- (a) That the General Manager ask Council staff to seek a letter of support from the Gladesville Hornsby Football Association, North West Sydney Women's Football Association and relevant local football clubs to apply to the Football NSW 'Let's Light Up Football fund'.
- (b) That should these letters of support be received, the maximum amount of \$20,000 be sought for each project applied for.

**3 PUTNEY HILL - FRASERS PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT -

MOTION:

- (a) That with the Frasers' "Putney Hill" development reaching completion, Council officers facilitate an urgent meeting with their senior management to discuss the Council's and community's concerns with respect to the condition of the assets that they propose to pass to Council.
- (b) That a report be commissioned to provide the condition information required to ensure that these assets are restored satisfactorily by Frasers for the community before they are passed to Council.
- (c) That a Council report be prepared and presented to Council once the meeting has been concluded and all investigations have been completed.

4 RYDE RIVER WALK - Councillor Roy Maggio**File Number: CLM/19/1/1/6 - BP19/288**

The Ryde River Walk was proposed as an integrated mixed-use path network along the Parramatta River foreshore between Wharf Road, Melrose Park and Punt Road, Gladesville, to allow for pedestrian and cycle opportunities with meeting and resting areas along the way. The Ryde River Walk Master Plan was adopted by Council on 4 September 2007. The most recent improvements have been in Bill Mitchell Park, Glades Bay Park, Looking Glass Bay and Banjo Paterson Reserve, however the final pieces of the Master Plan are still yet to be constructed.

MOTION:

- (a) That a report be prepared for Council that identifies the risks and challenges for completing remaining sections of the Ryde River Walk and provides options for further implementation of the Master Plan.
- (b) That this report come back to Council before October of this year.
