	Bev Debrincat introduced everyone to the Habitat and the new facilities that opened in December. "The Habitat" is open every Wednesday and Saturday 10 am to 4 pm. The Gladesville catchment collects and channels an area of over 36 hectares draining into the lower section of the catchment and connecting to the Parramatta River. The project area includes suburbs and parks in Gladesville, Tennyson point and Putney.

City of Ryde has partnered with the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) for 2015/2016 and aims to reduce the amount of litter entering our stormwater drains and thus polluting the Parramatta River. This will be achieved through a number of ways:

- An Anti-Littering education campaign to raise awareness of the impact of littering on the environment, particularly in the Gladesville area. This will be achieved through engaging with the community by providing educational resources, getting community ownership through pledges and engaging with local businesses.
- Installation of **drain stenciling at 25 locations in Gladesville**. This helps in minimizing litter and pollutants ending up in the Parramatta River.
- A "before and after" litter count is carried out to measure the success of the litter awareness campaign and the installation of the Gross Pollutant Trap.
- Providing 'No Litter' car bags and colour-in story book related to litter to community.
- A mural about effect of litter on waterways will be painted in trim place, Victoria Road, Ryde from next week
- **Story telling session** at Gladesville Library- every Friday starting from 3rd term, 22nd July.
