#### Yaama Boys



Yaama Boys have been around for more than 10 years spreading knowledge and traditions of the people of this land. With some dances and cultural beliefs coming from mainly the Wiradjuri nation, Yuin nation for the South Coast and many other nations and clans from the coastal line of Australia. This group continues to share the stories and knowledge of the elders they were taught by, one example being Uncle Noel Butler from the South Coast, who plays a major role in providing the knowledge to create the artefacts that the boys dance with and display.




















# National Schools Tree Day

- Champion teacher to lead and guide the student group through this project


### How to apply:





  - Schools Participation prize for the school with the most entries






