Revised Draft Masterplan – Changes Made from Feedback Received

As a result of the feedback received during the Stage 2 Have Your Say we have revised the Draft Masterplan design with the following:

- Inclusion of sports field lighting, subject to a Development Application
- Additional on site car parking spaces and potential further expansion subject to a Traffic Report and Development Application
- New cricket nets
- New outdoor fitness equipment
- More trees, grass and groundcover plants
- Improved natural area
- Improved embankment including view corridors
- Improved paths and trails
- Additional seating and picnic shelters
- Improved park entrances and signage.


Revised Draft Masterplan – Inclusion of Sports Field Lighting

CITY OF RYDE

- 43.1% forecast population growth (2016 2036)
- Community demand for sports fields is increasing
- City of Ryde has a current shortfall of sports fields
- Northern Sydney Regional Organisation of Councils has identified shortfall in sports fields

SPORTS FIELD AVAILABILITY

- Current shortfall in sports fields (especially sports fields with lighting)
- Maximum capacity for turf sports field = 30 hrs/week
- Forecast population growth = further increased demand in sports fields
- Operational sustainability.

About Sports Field Lighting in City of Ryde


- Over 30 sports field/netball/tennis facilities have sports field/court lighting
- 1 sports field has lighting Development Application on exhibition
- Development Application Conditions of Consent stipulate the permitted days and hours of operation.

About Sports Field Lighting

SPORTS FIELD LIGHTING OPERATION

- Proposed Monday Friday 4.30pm 9.30pm.
 (subject to Development Application)
- Lighting operations controlled by Council using electronic system
- Restricts days/time, sets users and sets cut off times
- Authorised club contact turn lights on/off using mobile phone text message.

SPORTS FIELD LIGHTING APPLICATION AND REPORT

- Initial Lighting Concept has been obtained
- Meets Australian Standards (AS2560 & AS4282) lux and spill levels
- Detailed Lighting Design
 - Will be obtained as part of Development Application
- Lighting, Traffic and Acoustic Reports
 - Will be obtained as part of Development Application




LED light fitting (Raptor – source: Sylvania) Fitting is use at Westminster Park, Marsfield Park and Meadowbank Park Field 10
