Community Update on the Argyle Centre and Ryde Bowling Club sites

Council is currently considering its options with respect to two of its vacant sites known as the Argyle Centre (part of Council's Investment Property Portfolio) and the Ryde Bowling Club (Recreation/Community Facility), adjacent to each other on the corner of Argyle Avenue and Blaxland Road, Ryde.

Council is excited about the options available for the community in utilising these two sites. For the Argyle Centre, this includes developing the site to provide additional retail, residential or commercial space that will increase revenue from other sources other than rates, and reinforcing Council's commitment in keeping the Council's rates as low as possible.

The Ryde Bowling Club site is currently vacant and provides the opportunity to provide essential community space, whilst also considering activating the disused bowling green for recreational sport.

Council will be considering the above options for these sites, which are outlined in this brochure and we encourage you to provide us with your feedback.

Argyle Centre

The Argyle Centre was originally built in 1926 as a theatre and has over its time been used as a retail outlet, a community centre, a hall and most recently Council staff offices.

In 2012, an assessment of the Argyle Centre that detailed the building condition and WHS issues affecting the work environment, recommended that all staff and use cease with a permanent closure from August 2012.

It is part of Council's Investment Property Portfolio, in proposing to redevelop the site with a mix of retail and residential development.

To increase the City of Ryde's revenue other than rates, Council is proposing to lease the site to grow Council's on-going revenue. It may incorporate residential apartments including key worker housing into this development. As stated, the City of Ryde will continue to own this development in assisting Council build a new revenue stream for the benefit of the City of Ryde community.

The zoning for this space is B4 - Mixed Use. Council anticipates that the developed site would be similar to other sites that have been recently developed in the area.

Ryde Bowling Club

The Ryde Bowling Club is a recreation facility located mostly on Crown Land, with the City of Ryde having care control and management of the land. As this site is located on Crown Land, it cannot be sold.

The Bowling Club was established in 1908 and operated as a Bowling Club until 2012. The Club currently stands vacant and Council is considering the best use for the site.

The zoning for this space is RE1 - Public Recreation which allows for a broad range of permissible uses such as:

- Community facilities
- Environmental facilities

- Recreation facilities (both indoor and outdoor)
- Restaurants and cafes
