## **Synopsis**

The most important things in Arwa el Masri's life are her family and her faith ... and then her love of food. *Tea with Arwa* tells her personal story and her belief that regardless of faith, we are all looking for the same things: safety, love and a sense of home.

## **Author Biography**

Arwa is a child of many countries. She was born in Saudi Arabia in 1976, lived in America as a child and spent time with her extended family in Syria. As the child of Palestinian migrants she was a stateless person with no recognised home country. In 1990 Arwa became an Australian citizen. She is married to legendary Australian rugby league player Hazem El Masri.
