

TERRYS CREEK WALK

Terrys Creek Walk

Discover Terrys Creek Walk, an important bushland link to Lane Cove National Park. With its impressive waterfall, sandstone outcrops and bushland there is plenty to explore.

Home to a wide variety of native species including Swamp Wallabies, Echidnas, Bandicoots, Sugar Gliders and Powerful Owls. The bushland around Terrys Creek Walk forms a significant wildlife corridor.

Why not challenge yourself by walking the length of Terrys Creek from Eastwood to Browns Waterhole?



Wood Street to Epping Road 1.5km, 30 minutes one-way

Visit the waterfall located near the Wood Street entry. Walk to Dence Park on the western side of Terrys Creek by using the stepping stone creek crossing or continue north under Epping Road towards Land Cove National Park.



Epping Road to Lane Cove National Park 1km, 20 minutes one-way

From Epping Road follow Terrys Creek northwards, pass under the M2 Motorway and continue on to Browns Waterhole. Note the change in the vegetation as you move further away from the creek line and look out for native wildflowers.

Help us with the management of the bushland areas by keeping to the walking trails and ensure that dogs are on leash at all times. Avoid using the Terrys Creek walk during or after heavy rainfall. Floodwaters can rise very quickly at this location.
