## NEW WHARF STREET BOAT RAMP BOOST FOR RIVERLIFE AND BOATIES

The Ermington Wharf Road Boat Ramp has reopened after an \$831,000 refurbishment.

The old jetty has been replaced and the boat ramp widened to three lanes providing a first class boat launching facility for residents and river users.

The new wharf and boat ramp forms part of a growing number of river access points along the Ryde Riverwalk from Gladesville to Melrose Park (and on to Parramatta), linking foreshore parklands creating a regional commuter and recreational link.

## **Access points include:**

- Boat Ramps and Recreational Jetties: Kissing Point and Wharf Rd, West Ryde (Ermington),
- Recreational Jetty Ryde Wharf at Belmore Street
- Wharves Cruise Boats: Banjo Patterson Park
- Wharves Public Ferries (owned by Ministry of Transport) Kissing Point and Meadowbank

## **Pedestrian Access to River:**

 Beach at John Whitton Rail Bridge, Settlers Park, Bennelong Park, Kissing Point Park, Beach at Tennyson Park, Deeble Street staircase and Punt Road.

The restoration of the wharf ensures this recreational facility, that has been part of Parramatta River's colourful history in various forms since early colonial times, will enjoy a working life well into the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

The Ermington Wharf road boat Ramp is located on the Council boundary between the cities of Ryde and Parramatta. Funds for the upgrade came from a joint Council submission to NSW Maritime under their Better Boating Program.
