JOIN OUR FIGHT AGAINST GRAFFITI

On Sunday 2 May, residents can take a stand against graffiti vandalism by participating in the state's first Graffiti Action Day.

Councils, community groups and volunteers will join forces to rid their local area of unsightly graffiti as part of the Keep Australia Beautiful campaign.

The Mayor, Clr Michael Butterworth, said: "Our Council is committed to removing graffiti within 24-48 hours of it being report and outlays around \$200,000 pa removing graffiti.

"Graffiti Action Day is an ideal opportunity to launch a new partnership between the City of Ryde and Ryde Rotary to work together to boost our fight against this scourge of modern society."

The partnership brings together the manpower of Rotary and the Council's purchase of a new \$4,000 pressure spray to identify and remove graffiti from all private and commercial properties in a newly established 'graffiti free zone' around Top Ryde.

"This is a win-win situation for the whole community and a terrific opportunity for local government and Rotary to work together for the benefit of all," the Deputy Mayor, CIr Roy Maggio commented.
