## HAVE YOUR SAY ON HOW TO KEEP CRIME LOW New Crime Prevention Plan Now on Public Exhibition

To ensure that the City of Ryde maintains its reputation as a safe community in which to live, work and visit, Council has produced a new Crime Prevention Plan and is inviting members of the community to comment.

The Mayor, Clr Artin Etmekdjian said: "We are very fortunate to live in a safe community with low levels of crime, and we want to keep it that way.

"In drawing up this action plan, the Council has consulted with 14 key organisations, including the Police, Chambers of Commerce, the University and shopping centres, who have all pledged their support and resources to the Plan's implementation.

"Now it is time for the community to have their say."

Following a comprehensive analysis of crime statistics and local intelligence, stealing related offences in three hot spot locations – Macquarie Park, West Ryde and Ryde – are the primary focus of the action plan.

The draft Crime Prevention Plan is on public exhibition until Monday 14 February.
