SUSTAINABLE WASTE 2 ART PRIZE WINNERS

Winners of the City of Ryde SWAP (Sustainable Waste2Art Prize) 2017 were announced this week.

Using recycled materials and the theme of 'sustainable living' judges chose 79 works from 160 entries for exhibition from artists as young as eleven.

SWAP Curator, Ben Eadie, said: "We were stunned by the quality and diversity of the works. Each piece showed a creative, imaginative understanding of the sustainable living theme."
