Hosted by Ryde Youth Council over three days in September (Friday 22 – Sunday 24), YCC 2017 Make IT Happen is a celebration of youth leadership that will see members of Youth Advisory Committees from across the State congregate to showcase their successes and develop innovative projects they can take back to their communities.

Ryde Council's Project Community Officer Young People, Mike Paine said: "Working with members of the Ryde Youth Council to pull this event together has been fantastic. We have devised a stimulating program of presentations, workshops and collaborative events designed to motivate the audience."

Ryde Youth Council's spokesperson, Sophie Lara-Watson said: "This will be a great collaborative experience for over 200 Youth Council representatives coming from as far afield as Bathurst, Snowy Valleys, Gunnedah Shire and Armidale.
