New Council Opposes Eastwood Park Carpark

The first action of the new City of Ryde Council was to vote on a Mayoral Minute to oppose a car park being built in any part of Eastwood Park.

The meeting resolved eight votes to four to advise Transport for NSW, the Minister for Transport and the Local Member for Ryde, Victor Dominello, of its opposition to the proposal.

Ryde Mayor, Clr Jerome Laxale, said: "The people of Ryde elected a Council to protect Eastwood Oval and we did so as our first matter of business. We will now use every resource we have to protect Eastwood Park."

The meeting also resolved to no longer provide assistance to Transport for NSW, or its agents, in respect of any car park proposal affecting Eastwood Park and to prepare a submission stating Council's opposition to Eastwood Park being used for the purpose of a car park, should a proposal be published seeking feedback.

The meeting recommended that Council enter into bilateral discussions and investigations with the State Government, local residents and local land owners for redevelopment of the existing car parks in Glen Street and Rowe Street, Eastwood.

The Deputy Mayor, thanked the Mayor and his fellow Councillors for entrusting him with the role of Deputy Mayor. Clr Gordon said he looked forward to the opportunity

of serving as Deputy Mayor and to working with the Mayor and the community in his new role.

"I believe the most important thing we can do as Councillors is to work together for the advancement of our City and its citizens with a new vision that will lift the spirits of the community."


The volunteers had great fun spending their day immersed in nature with family and friends.
