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General Manager's Overview

Quarterly Overview

This Quarterly Review reports on the progress towards the achievement of the City of Ryde's Delivery Plan 2016-2020 including One Year Operational Plan 2016/17 as at 30 June 2017. Council monitors the progress of the Operational Plan on a quarterly basis, with the report highlighting Council's performance against key indicators and the planned projects.

As a result of the June Quarterly Review, Council's available Working Capital is projected to increase to \$4.85 million.

The June Quarterly Review also updates Council's list of Carryovers from 2016/17 financial year to the 2017/18 financial year. This has resulted in the Carryovers approved by Council at its meeting on 28 June 2017, of \$12.52 million, increasing to \$12.59 million, noting that \$6 million in this list, relates to the park in Waterloo Road, Macquarie Park.

It should also be noted that the summary of Council's actual result to budget is not Council's final position, as it is still subject to audit. Council's draft Financial Statements for 2016/17 will be provided to Council at its meeting on Tuesday 22 August 2017.

This report demonstrates Council's commitment to complete the majority of planned projects in our 2016/17 Operational Plan. In total there were 123 Capital and Non Capital projects, which had an end date of 30 June 2017. The 123 projects are made up of our 2016/17 Operational Plan projects, new projects added throughout the year by Council resolution and projects carried over into this year from 2015/16. Of those projects, 64 were completed with a further 32 projects that were on track to be completed, now proposed to be carried over due to various factors such as weather, or are multiple year projects, eight projects were cancelled, with three projects relating to the proposed merger. Five projects were deferred and four not started. There are 10 projects identified as action required in this report and each of these, has a detailed comment as to the reason for the delay.

The following summary below is provided on the key components of Council's Operational Plan 2016/17 and is supported by detailed information in the appendices.



Financial Position

Following this quarter's budget review as stated, Council's financial position has improved with a net increase of \$2.54 million in Council's Operating Surplus. A majority of this increase relates to Section 94 contributions received (\$2.13 million) and 2017/18 Financial Assistant Grant received in 2016/17. The additional Section 94 contribution and Financial Assistant Grant received will be transferred to Reserves as part of June Review.

The Capital Works Program, YTD, is at approximately 98.04% net financially, excluding contributed assets.

Operating expenses, YTD, are within 5.02% (favourable) of the budgeted amounts, which is a good result.

Operating Income (Base Budget and Non-Capital & Capital Income) is projected to increase by \$2.34 million (1.66%) and Operating Expenses are projected to decrease by \$0.20 million (-0.21%), a net increase in Operating Surplus of \$2.54 million to \$47.90 million. This is an excellent result given the tight revenue base from which we are operating.

Council had budgeted to undertake \$45.83 million of capital works. This is projected to increase by another \$0.21 million. This will give a total capital works budget of \$46.05 million.

Base Budget

Base Budget Income is projected to increase by \$1.66 million to \$116.44 million, while Base Budget Expenses are maintained at \$91.64 million, giving a net projected increase in the Base Budget Surplus of \$1.66 million (7.16%).

Non-Capital Budget

Non-Capital Expenses are projected to decrease by \$0.20 million to \$3.09 million, giving a net projected decrease in net Non-Capital Expenditure of \$0.24 million (-7.99%).

Capital Budget

Capital Income is projected to increase by \$0.64 million to \$25.82 million, while Capital Expenses are projected to increase by \$0.21 million to \$46.05 million, giving a net projected reduction in net Capital Expenditure of \$0.43 million.



Reserve Movements

The net movement of Reserves was budgeted to be a net transfer from reserves of \$0.60 million for works carried over plus funding other works. This is projected to have a net increase of \$2.29 million to reserves to a total of \$1.69 million transfer to reserves.

As identified in the table below, all the corporate indicators are, with the exception of five, on track.

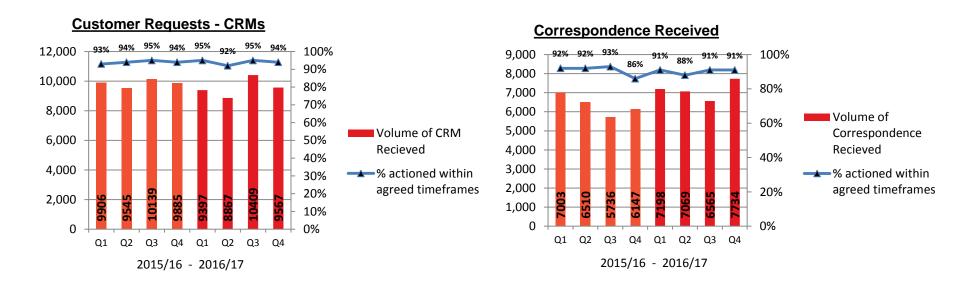

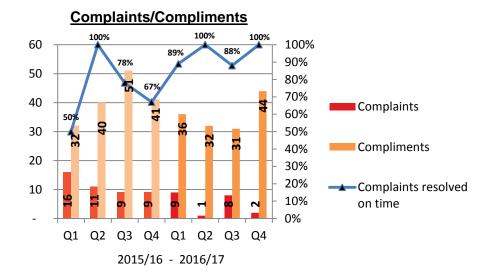
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The following corporate indicators met the target this quarter, noting that the organisation will be working to improve further or maintain this result at the next quarter:-



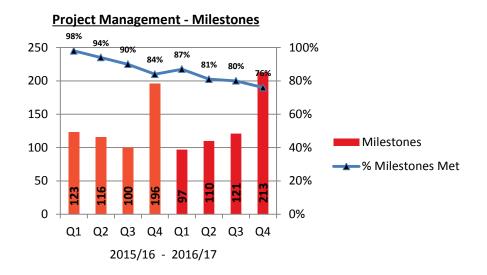
We have maintained our high response rate to customer requests. Our result was 94% for requests actioned within agreed timeframes. This is above our target of 90% and continues our trend of achieving over the target again highlights our continued commitment to excellent customer service.

Our responsiveness to inward correspondence result was maintained. Our result was 91% which is just above our target of 90% but still on trend of achieving on or around 90%.



Our handling of complaints indicator increased back to 100% this quarter against our target of 100%. Again it is pleasing to see that the number of compliments Council received far outnumbers the number of complaints.

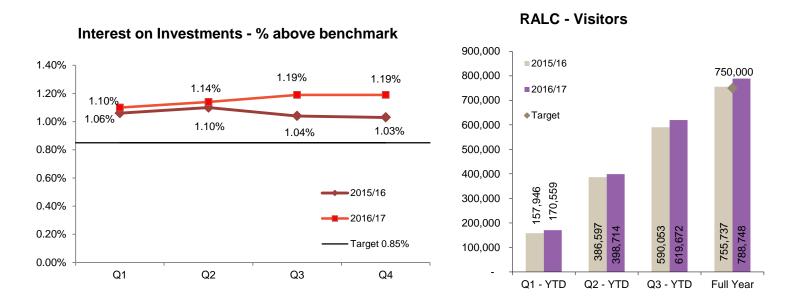
The corporate indicators which have not met target this quarter and where we will look for an improvement on next quarter are:-



We had a decrease of 4% in our number of milestones met on time indicator in Q4, with a result of 76% against our target of 90%. This measure is only for milestones scheduled in Q4 and of the 213 milestones scheduled, 162 were met on time.

Program Indicators

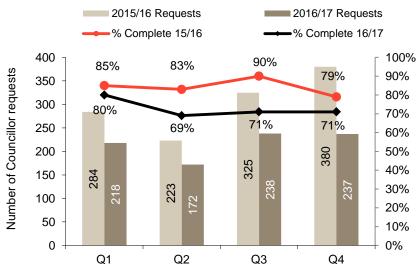
I would like to draw particular attention to the following areas of Council where performance has improved against previous trends or targets:



Council's investments still continue to exceed the investment benchmark even better than the previous year. With the cash rate at an historical low we have been doing well to hold our returns at this level.

Visitor numbers to the RALC have continued to be stronger than last year. There was a four percent increase on last year and there was also a 27% percent increase from previous quarter. This is a positive result and exceeded our annual target of 750,000 patrons by 38,748.

Councillor Helpdesk Requests



Although the number of councillor requests responded to is below the target of 90% it is pleasing to see an increase in this indicator maintained at 71%. We will look to improve on this result further next year.

Year 1 works included site constraint considerations, archaeological and indigenous community consultation. Year 2 will commence on-ground works and will combine soft and hard engineering solutions. This project seeks to upgrade the existing bushland track (about 2km of track) connecting from Epping Rd and adjoining Lane Cove National Park through to Eastwood. The track compliments Parramatta Council's parallel walking trail on the opposite side of the creek and seeks to provide residents with the opportunity to engage with the natural settings of Terry's Creek and promote active recreation linking the National Park.

This year the service has had an increase of sign ups applying for the service and a 45% increase in audit participation since last year. This clearly shows there is a growing desire for home sustainability advice and the service City of Ryde are providing. The project is also evaluated annually and results show that overwhelming residents are learning new ways to reduce their waste, water and energy consumption through participating. 95% of all participants are also implementing most or some of the recommendations made during the home assessment.

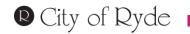
