3.	Business Survey Results  Sui Li presented the results of the above survey.  The survey consisted of twelve questions designed to provide key indicators as to how people feel about operating businesses in Ryde.  • The survey was sent to 13,750 subscribers  • 4083 people viewed the survey  • 533 participated (a good figure)  • 66% of respondents believe the number of people visiting Ryde has increased.  • Employee numbers are expected to grow in the next two years  • People would like to see improvements to the amount of parking provided, a greater variety of business encouraged and shop front improvements.  • The results of the survey will be made available via enewsletters and will be provided to Councillors and this committee. 4.	<ul> <li>Affordable Housing Policy</li> <li>The policy is currently on exhibition for comment</li> <li>The aim of the policy is to ensure that affordable housing in provided in this community</li> <li>By 2031, Council hopes to be a leader in the provision of key worker housing</li> <li>The target is for 5% of new dwellings to be affordable housing to be made available to people on low to moderate incomes.</li> <li>Developers have been seeking clear guidelines on this matter for some time.</li> <li>Council can't work alone and will be working with other organisations to achieve affordable housing.</li> <li>Management of the new housing will be undertaken by Community Housing companies.</li> <li>Goal is for 600 new affordable dwellings, 400 from State Govt and 200 from Council through the DA process.</li> <li>Construction of 20 or more units is required before the affordable housing provisions come into force.</li> <li>There is much confusion about the terms used in respect of affordable housing.</li> <li>Still many questions about how do you choose the people to go into affordable housing and how do you control the price etc.</li> </ul>	The information was noted.
